Title: P20CA00004 DE SANTIAGO - W. YEDRA ROAD PLAN AMENDMENT

## Introduction/Background:

The applicant requests an amendment of the Pima County Comprehensive Plan from the Low Intensity Rural (LIR) to Medium Intensity Rural (MIR) land use designation on 4.77 acres located approx. 1200 feet east of the intersection of W. Yedra Road and S. Vahalla Road in the Southwest Planning Area.

## Discussion:

The change in land use designation would permit an increase in residential density from 0.3 residences per acre (RAC) to 1.2 RAC, to allow a future rezoning from RH Rural Homestead to GR-1 Rural Residential zoning, to permit a single division of the property to allow two family members to own separate parcels to care for aging parents on the property.

#### Conclusion:

The site is outside the Maeveen Marie Behan Conservation Lands System, is similar to other approved amendment requests in the region, and is in the Pima Prospers Southwest Focused Development Investment (growth) Area.

#### Recommendation:

Staff and the Planning and Zoning Commission recommend APPROVAL of the Comprehensive Plan amendment, subject to one rezoning policy to require avoiding development in regulated riparian habitat.

### COMPREHENSIVE PLAN AMENDMENT

#### P20CA00004 DE SANTIAGO – W. YEDRA ROAD PLAN AMENDMENT

Tony and Carmen De Santiago, represented by Judith De Santiago, request a Comprehensive Plan amendment of approximately 4.77 acres from Low Intensity Rural (LIR) to Medium Intensity Rural (MIR) land use designation, located approximately 1200 feet east of the intersection of W. Yedra Road and S. Vahalla Road, and addressed as 7600 W. Yedra Road, in Section 21, Township 15 South, Range 12 East, in the Southwest Planning Area. On motion, the Planning and Zoning Commission voted to recommend APPROVAL SUBJECT TO A REZONING POLICY (8-0, Commissioners Bain and Hook were absent). Staff recommends APPROVAL SUBJECT TO A REZONING POLICY.

#### Planning and Zoning Commission Public Hearing Summary (November 25, 2020)

Chairman Johns and staff were present in the hearing room; the remaining seven commissioners participated via telephone as a public health precaution due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Staff presented information about the proposed Comprehensive Plan amendment to the commission and explained the owners' desire to ultimately rezone the property to split for ownership by family members.

A commissioner asked staff under what circumstances denial of such a request would be considered, and if there should be broader consideration of the land use in this region. Staff responded that there were obvious cases when a request would be recommended for denial (e.g., within the Conservation Lands System, regulated riparian habitat); and, that the region should be examined for an increase in land use intensity, probably during the next Comprehensive Plan update.

The applicant spoke and said that the parcels would be split between two siblings, who would share the care of aging parents on the property. The commission had no questions.

The commission opened the public hearing. No one requested to speak and the commission closed the public hearing.

Commissioner Gungle made a motion to recommend **APPROVAL SUBJECT TO A REZONING POLICY**; Commissioner Becker gave second.

A commissioner asked if this request was eligible for a concurrent plan amendment and rezoning. Staff replied that the subject parcel lacked the appropriate abutting land use designation or zoning of higher intensity that would have permitted a concurrent amendment and rezoning request.

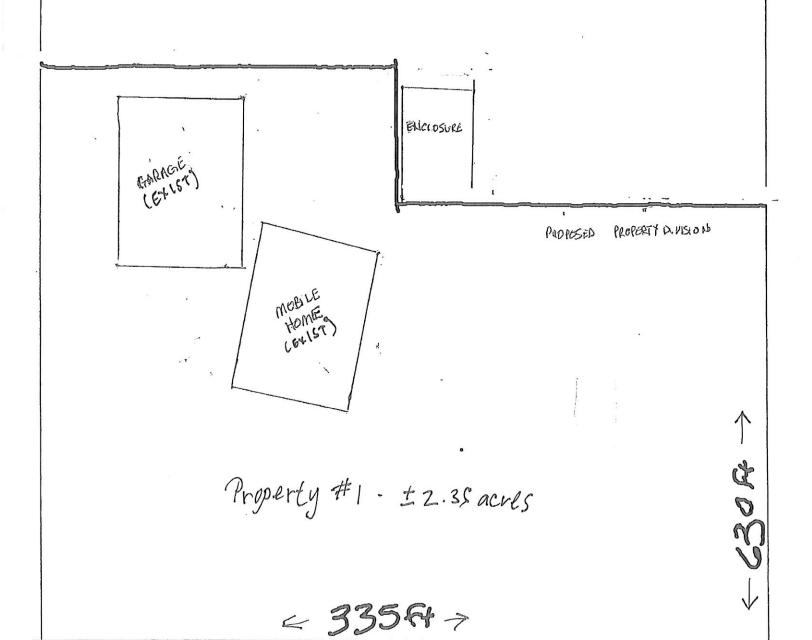

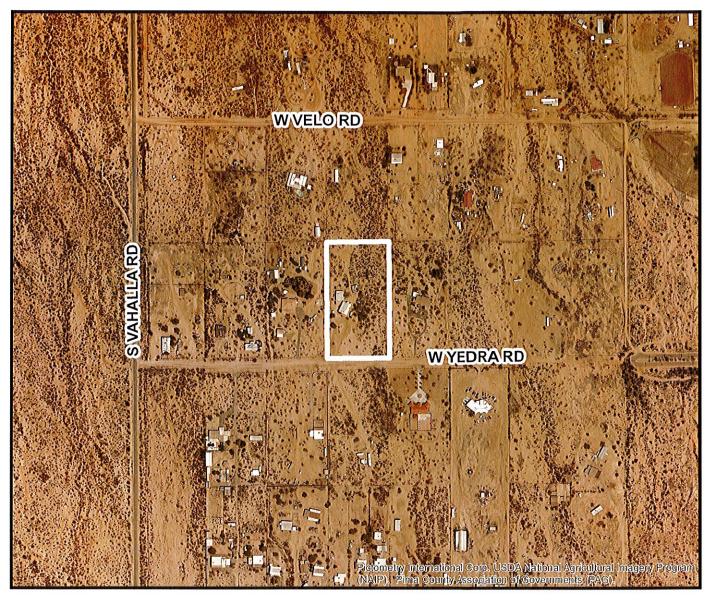


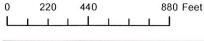

#### APPLICANT'S STATED REASONS TO AMEND THE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN:

"We are submitting a Comprehensive Amendment Plan Application to divide this property into two roughly equal lots for the purpose of building a home on each lot. One lot will be the property owners' home and the other lot would be his eldest daughter's home. The current acreage is 4.77, so dividing it into two lots would make each lot about 2.3 acres each. The current land use is designated as Low Intensity Rural which for our intended purposes would need to be changed to Medium Intensity Rural as submitted on the application."

#### STAFF REPORT:

Staff recommends APPROVAL of the proposed Comprehensive Plan amendment to Medium Intensity Rural (MIR). The amendment property is within the Comprehensive Plan Southwest Focused Development Investment Area identified for growth, and outside the Maeveen Marie Behan Conservation Lands System. County departments, agencies and other stakeholders have no objections to the requested amendment. The Regional Flood Control District recommends the following rezoning policy:

The 4.77-acre comprehensive plan amendment property shall be split into north and south parcels at rezoning to avoid and minimize disturbance to Pima County Regulated Riparian Habitat.

#### Background

The amendment property (hereafter, *property*) is 4.77 acres in area, located in southwestern Tucson about 1.4 miles south of W. Valencia Road and 1,200 feet east of W. Vahalla Road, on the north side of W. Yedra Road. The property is zoned RH (Rural Homestead) and is developed with a single residence and accessory structures. Most of the remainder of the parcel is undeveloped and roughly the eastern half of the property is designated as Xeroriparian C habitat.

The property ranges in elevation from 2,560 feet on the south end to 2,550 feet at the north end, with a gentle grade from south to north; Average Cross Slope is approximately two percent.

The property and surrounding parcels are un-subdivided and have LIR land use and RH zoning, with a few scattered properties that were amended to MIR and subsequently rezoned to GR-1 (Rural Residential) for lot splits. Other smaller parcels in the area that were not rezoned were most likely created prior to the adoption of the RH zone in November 1985. The property is located in a broader region of mixed land uses: there is high-density single-family residential development in the Star Valley Specific Plan area with Planned Development Community (PDC) land use designation to the east; planned and constructed residential subdivisions with mainly CR-3 (Single Residence) and CR-4 (Mixed-Dwelling Type) zoning, and Medium Intensity Urban (MIU) land use designation to the north; undeveloped federal and state lands to the west with RH zoning, and MIU and Resource Sensitive (RS) land use designations; and, Tohono O'odham reservation lands to the south.

#### Plan Amendment Criteria

Staff has reviewed this plan amendment request to determine if one or more of the following criteria have been adequately met:

### 1a. Growing Smarter Acts

The request is a simple division of property to allow multiple generations of family to live on separately-owned adjacent parcels.

#### 1b. Comprehensive Plan Policies, Special Area Policies, and Rezoning Policies

The property is within Special Area Policy S-29 Southwest Infrastructure Plan (SWIP), to guide provision of infrastructure and services related to transportation, flood control, wastewater and parks. The property is also within the Southwest Focused Development Investment Area (FDIA), designated under the 2015 comprehensive plan update *Pima Prospers* as a growth area identified for a variety of land uses, infrastructure expansion, and multi-modal transportation.

#### 1c. Maeveen Marie Behan Conservation Lands System

The property is outside the Maeveen Marie Behan Conservation Lands System (MMBCLS).

#### 2. Oversights, Inconsistencies, or Land Use Related Inequities/Changes

The property and area immediately surrounding have LIR land use designation, for a gross residential density of 0.3 residences per acre (RAC); the proposed amendment to MIR would increase the density to 1.2 RAC. There were six similar amendment requests approved in this area between 1994 and 2015, the last two being individual requests approved under Pima Prospers. The other smaller parcels in the area created prior to the RH zone would be considered legal non-conforming.

The proposed amendment meets and is supported by comprehensive plan policies, is within a plan-designated growth area, and does not impact MMBCLS areas. The increase in density of one parcel and residence should have negligible effect on surrounding properties.

#### **DEPARTMENT/AGENCY COMMENTS:**

#### **Department of Transportation**

The department has no comments.

#### Regional Flood Control District

The entire site is within Federal Emergency Management Agency Special Flood Hazard Area

Zone A. Much of the eastern half of the site is also impacted by Pima County Regulated Riparian Habitat (PCRRH). The applicant has configured the split to provide a building area outside the PCRRH as requested. Due to the presence of the flood hazard and PCRRH, a Floodplain Use Permit is required for development. Therefore the District has no objection, subject to a rezoning policy on splitting the parcels to avoid disturbance to PCRRH.

#### **Regional Wastewater Reclamation Department**

The department has no comments.

#### **Environmental Planning Division**

The site is located outside of the MMBCLS, but is within the Priority Conservation Area for the Pima Pineapple cactus (*Coryphantha scheeri* var. *robustispina*). A survey for the cactus may be required at the time of rezoning.

#### **Cultural Resources & Historic Preservation Division**

The subject property is within a high archaeological sensitivity zone as designated by the Sonoran Desert Conservation Plan. A cultural resources survey may be required as a condition of any future rezoning.

#### **Department of Environmental Quality**

The proposed residential properties will use on-site wastewater (septic) systems.

#### Natural Resources, Parks and Recreation

There are no planned or constructed county trails, nor other county recreational facilities in the vicinity of the comprehensive plan amendment site.

#### Trico Electric Cooperative

Trico has no comments.

#### **Tucson Unified School District**

The district has no comments.

## Diablo Village (Metropolitan Southwest) Water District

The district has no comments.

#### **Drexel Heights Fire District**

Drexel Heights does not object to this amendment but this area does not have an established water infrastructure to supply fire flow to hydrants. If a land split is approved all structures will be required to meet fire flow for those structures along with access to those structures.

#### Kitt Peak National Observatory

Kitt Peak Observatory has no comments.

#### US Fish & Wildlife Service

USFWS has no comments.

#### San Xavier District, Tohono O'odham Nation / Pasqua Yaqui Nation

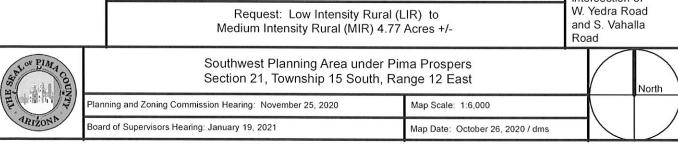

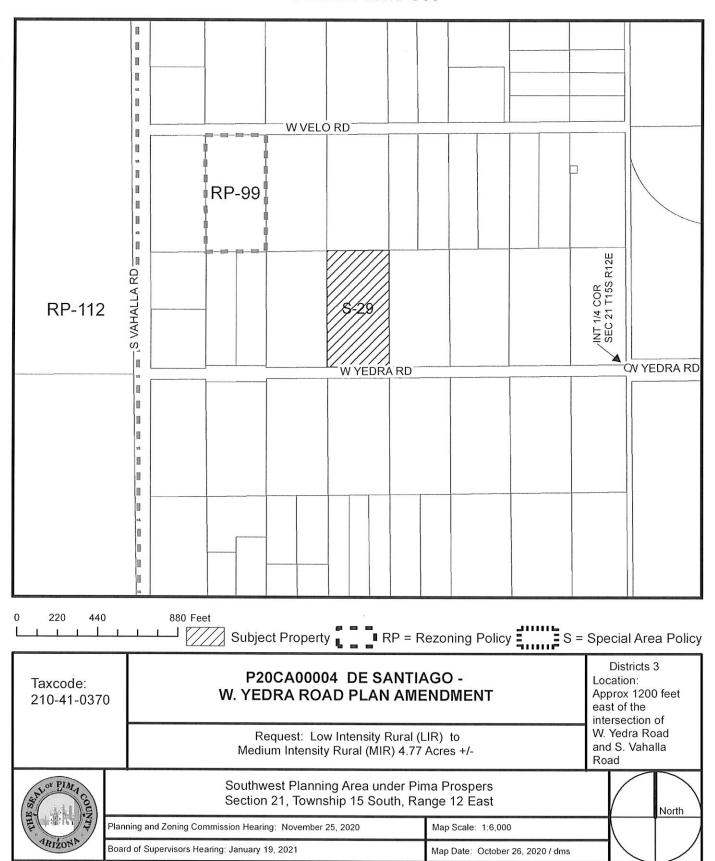

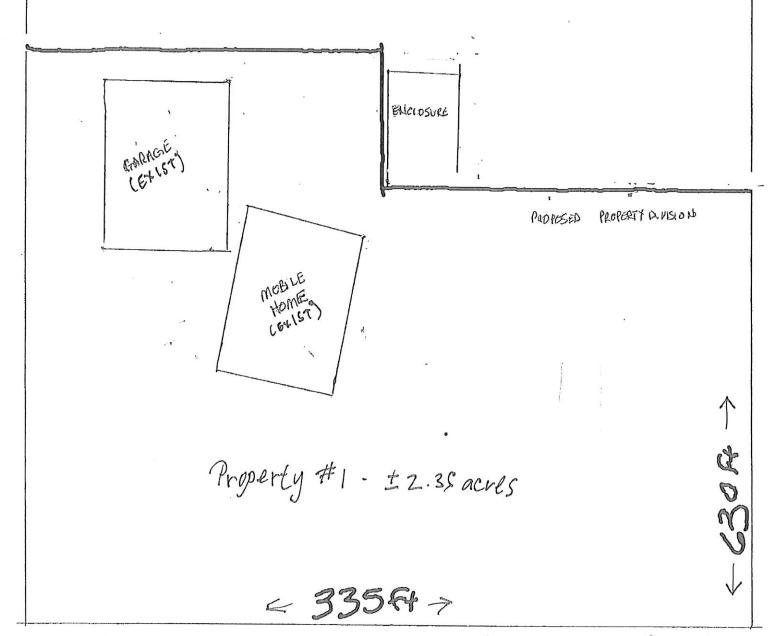
