Grant Award: Tucson Mountain Park-Saguaro National Park Historic District, National Register of Historic Places Nomination

#### \*Purpose:

Pima County is applying for the 2020 Certified Local Government Pass-Through (CLG) Grant to provide revisions to a draft nomination for the Tucson Mountain Park-Saguaro National Park Historic District for listing on the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP). In 2018, Pima County was awarded a CLG gran to prepare the nomination. The Arizona State Historic Sites Review Committee approved the nomination in the summer of 2019. As the nomination covers federal land administered by the National Park Service (NPS), NPS officials reviewed the nomination and forwarded it to the Keeper of the National Register office for final review. The Keeper's office returned the nomination and required revisions in December 2020. The current grant application is to update the NRHP nomination based on comments submitted by the Keeper's office.

#### \*Program Goals/Predicted Outcomes:

The Tucson Mountain Park-Saguaro National Park Historic District is a designed park landscape of 28,708 contiguous acres on the western slopes of the Tucson Mountains in Pima County. The district corresponds closely with the original Tucson Mountain Park, which opened in 1932 as a Pima County park, and today encompasses all of Saguaro National Park west, and a large portion of the County-owned and managed park. The creation of the park was seen as a way to preserve a large tract of undeveloped wilderness just outside the city. In 1933, two Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) camps were established in the park. Using federal Emergency Conservation Work funds, the National Park Service (NPS) designed and carried out projects to expand and improve the few existing park facilities using CCC labor. From 1933 to 1941, CCC camp enrollees built picnic grounds, automobile roads, hiking and riding trails, erosion-control structures, water-supply facilities, and administrative buildings in the park. The goal was to make the area encompassed by the park accessible to the general public and to promote economic development through tourism. Many of the individual buildings and structures built in the period of significance, 1929 -1941, including the many built by the CCC after 1933, retain their integrity to this day. Listing this property on the National Register serves to document the wide array of CCC-built features that continue to provide recreational benefits to the public, and further to commemorate the CCC's outstanding contributions that served, and continue to serve, both residents and visitors alike for almost 90 years.

#### \*Public Benefit:

Since it's creation in 1932, the Tucson Mountain Park-Saguaro National Park Historic District has been managed as a signature recreational attraction in southern Arizona. The District is currently co-managed by the National Park Service and Pima County, and long standing cooperation between these two agencies has required a coordinated effort to ensure the conservation of this unique cultural landscape. Through this partnership, the vast array of CCC-built features continue to retain extraordinary interpretive value, provide an authentic recreational experience, and remain protected for the enjoyment by future generations.
