For the past 20+ years I have been in the education field. I have worked in elementary, middle and high school level as a music teacher and a few years as a preschool teacher. It is through my time as a preschool teacher that I saw the need for support in funding high-quality preschools. I was fortunate in that I was able to be a part of a high-quality preschool that had a waiting list for incoming clients. Due to burn out as a teacher I have now moved into a new field where I run grants that help support the teens that I worked with for so many years. There are many preschools out there that are not high-quality and have not been able to work towards being a high-quality because of lack of funding. I understand how much a child learns in a high-quality preschool, and I see those students that come into elementary school and beyond who have not had this high-quality early education.

This is where we need everyone's support. This is what I support and I hope that you all do the same:

- I support significant multi-year investment by Pima County in scholarships for high quality early childhood education.
- High-quality early childhood experiences mean that a child is more likely to succeed in school and in life. And that means not only better lives for these future adults, but significant savings for taxpayers. I am a constituent and teacher writing to voice my energetic support for the proposal to provide \$10,000,000 in scholarship money to lower-income children so that they may attend high-quality early education programs.

I have been a teacher at Tucson's prestigious Basis Tucson North middle school and high school for many years. We at BTN are tremendously proud of the work we do with students and the value we bring to the community. However, we still struggle to attract and keep students from diverse backgrounds, because many of those students have not received adequate preparation during their early childhood educations and are therefore simply not prepared for our rigorous curriculum when they are old enough to arrive at a Basis campus. Even when the students reach high school age, we teachers can usually easily identify which students had received high quality early education years before (indeed, we can often even tell what style of early education students received.) The effects of high-quality early childhood education are absolutely manifest to us into and beyond students' high school years.

By investing in early childhood education in Tucson, many more and more varied students will be able to receive the benefits of a Basis or other rigorous education. Having better prepared young children will materially help us increase the value we provide to our community.

We know that children who receive high-quality early education are able to thrive throughout their educations; indeed, the results of such investment pay off many times over as students pass through their primary and secondary educations and beyond. I emphatically encourage you to invest this money in scholarships for high-quality early childhood education in Tucson.

To Whom It May Concern,

I am currently the Director of Aftercare at Presidio School. I also perform other duties as an Administrative Assistant at the school. I have taught Preschool, Kindergarten and First grade. Anyone having worked with or taught young children knows the importance of a quality preschool education. Birth through five years of age is when the most important brain development takes place. Not only is this important for academic development but social and emotional development as well. When I was teaching first grade, I could always tell if a child had gone to a quality preschool. Their behavior in class was remarkably better. Their fine motor skills for writing, coloring, cutting and gluing was so much better. These students were often more able to use their words when having problems with other students instead using physical violence. They also already had an academic background and knew the letters of the alphabet, how to write their name, colors, numbers, etc. Students that had a quality preschool education are just more ready to be at school and are more prepared to learn. One study that I learned about when I was in college many years ago was the High/Scope Perry Preschool Project. They have completed a study of children who went to preschool to children who did not attend a preschool. They have followed the children, now adults, for 40 years. I've copied and pasted the quote below to my letter from the cost-benefit analysis section of the special study and the link is below.

"In constant 2000 dollars discounted at 3%, the economic return to society of the Perry Preschool program was \$244,812 per participant on an investment of \$15,166 per participant—\$16.14 per dollar invested."

In today's world, I believe the economic return to society would be even higher as more parents struggle to put food on the table, pay rent and just survive. Many children living in poor families have no way once they get to school to get caught up to their peers. The same home situation is still prevalent at home and parents have no extra time to help their children with homework and other activities that would benefit their children.
