***Project Title/Description:**

Intergovernmental Agreement for Public Health Emergency Preparedness and Mutual Aid

***Purpose:**

Pima County Health Department (PCHD) and Pascua Yaqui Tribe (PYT) desire to collaborate to ensure adequate information sharing, resource management, public health training, joint disease investigation, media releases, and operational support during public health emergencies.

***Procurement Method:**

This IGA is a non-Procurement contract and not subject to Procurement rules.

***Program Goals/Predicted Outcomes:**

Cooperative agreement by which Pima County will provide the Pascua Yaqui Tribe with training materials, disease surveillance information, and operational support during emergencies. The Pascua Yaqui Tribe agrees to the same level of collaboration.

***Public Benefit:**

This partnership with Tribal Government to care for populations affected by emergencies enhances public health emergency preparedness and response in Pima County.

***Metrics Available to Measure Performance:**

- PYT and PCHD agree to collaboration for planning, development, and making operational public health emergency response plans.
- PYT and PCHD agree to share information regarding disease surveillance, training, and jointly collaboration on all media releases involving Pascua Yaqui Tribe.
- PYT and PCHD agree to collaborate on resources needed for outbreak and disease investigation and supporting public health interventions such as personnel and logistics needed to receive, stage, and dispense Strategic National Stockpile assets at POD sites.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT

PASCUA YAQUI TRIBE AND PIMA COUNTY

1. PURPOSE: The Pascua Yaqui Tribe (Tribe), through the Pascua Yaqui Tribe Health Services Division (PYTHSD), is a federally recognized Indian tribe whose Reservation is located in Pima County, Arizona, agrees to participate in this shared agreement for joint public health activities with Pima County (County) through the Pima County Health Department (PCHD). The parties understand said Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) is intended as a vehicle to provide mutual support based on available resources and current laws, regulations, and the standard of care at the time of execution.

PYTHSD, to the extent possible with consideration to available resources (e.g., manpower, money, supplies, and equipment), and current Tribal Government policies, regulations, and procedures, as well as federal, state, and local laws as appropriate, will reciprocate assistance in accordance with the provisions of said IGA.

2. SCOPE: This IGA provides a mechanism for mutual support for full-spectrum threat response in the event of a natural disaster, Environmental, Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear, or High-Yield Explosives (CBRNE) event/incident, Hazardous Material (HAZMAT) event/incident, Weapons of Mass Destruction (WMD) terrorist attack or similar catastrophic event resulting in a mass casualty situation, or in such incidents which overwhelm the capabilities of participating public health agencies.

In addition, PCHD supports the Tribe's Emergency Operations Plan and Public Health Emergency Preparedness Plan, and other threat and catastrophic event response plans.

This IGA provides a mechanism for mutual support and coordination for situations that include:

- Public Health support and resources
- Epidemiological event activation
- Disease surveillance and investigation
- Surge support and resources
- Communications and media
- Trainings
- Coordinate for Emergency Prophylaxis/Pharmaceutical Dispensing Locations.

3. COORDINATION: PYTHSD will coordinate the following through PCHD. Most of these items consist of augmented support:

- a) Mass Immunization Coordination in the Event of a Public Health Emergency: The Tribe will support PCHD with mass immunization events in response to a biological incident. The Tribe will supply as much manpower, supplies, and vaccines as Tribal Government policies and available resources



allow. PCHD will reciprocate as its manpower, supplies, and vaccines allow in the event the Tribe's population requires mass immunization. PYTHSD will coordinate, with resource support arranged by PCHD.

- b) Disease/Syndromic Surveillance: PYTHSD is not a medical treatment facility. PYTHSD will report results of any epidemiologic investigation identifying any disease/illness case cluster or outbreak (natural or man-made). PCHD will inform PYTHSD of any disease/illness case cluster or outbreak in the county area. If scope of epidemiologic investigation is too much for either PCHD or PYTHSD, the offices will supply as much manpower and effort as available resources allow. PYTHSD and PCHD will collaborate on epidemiological investigations, to include use of the same epidemiological questionnaires during the investigation phase.
- c) Joint Training: To every extent possible, PCHD will extend invitations to the Tribe for training, drills, and exercises to foster collaboration and familiarity with systems and coordination. PYTHSD will participate in PCHD Multi-Year Training and Exercise Program and notify PCHD of any trainings, drills, or exercises sponsored by the Tribe.
- d) Communicable Disease Data Sharing: In the event of surveillance or investigation (both emergency and non-emergency situations) that requires epidemiological information, data gathering, or response to a perceived or actual threat of infectious disease with potential to impact public health, the parties will share information including:
 - Emerging infectious diseases.
 - Sharing aberration data report for STI and communicable diseases with Medical Directors.
 - Distribute PCHD enhanced surveillance bulletins via email to PYTHSD Medical Director.
 - Any equivalent reports from PYTHSD will be shared with PCHD to identify cross-jurisdictional interest or public health threat.
- e) Disease Investigations: If either PCHD or PYTHSD identifies a Pascua Yaqui tribal member in MEDSIS with a reportable disease, PCHD and PYTHSD will communicate and make every effort to coordinate a disease investigation. If a field investigation is required on the Tribe's Reservation, PCHD will first make every effort to inform the PYTHSD Medical Director prior to starting the investigation. Should the investigation require patient evaluation, specimen sampling, laboratory testing, and/or treatment, PCHD and PYTHSD agree to coordinate resources and follow-up activities as much as possible. PCHD agrees to assist in coordination, collection, and transport of reportable disease specimens when needed. Under terms of this IGA, PYTHSD will have 24/7 ability to access and utilize PCHD-contracted laboratories with Select Agent designation under the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Good efforts will be made to communicate between both health departments in the event of any suspected infectious disease involving a known Pascua Yaqui tribal member living on or off the Tribe's Reservation.
- f) Communications and Media: Prior to release of written, oral, or filmed public health or emergency information to the media, PCHD will consult with the Tribal Council if the Tribe is expected to be named, featured or otherwise mentioned. PYTHSD and PCHD agree to meet quarterly to discuss common public health issues or concerns. The Tribe and PCHD agree to jointly participate in press



conferences and/or activation of regional Joint Information System processes for emergency management.

- g) Surge Capacity: Given recommendations and actions set forth in the Arizona Mutual Aid Compact (AMAC), the table in **APPENDIX B** (2 pages) outlines the PYTHSD surge capacity response and reflects integration of PCHD consistent with participation in the AMAC.
- h) Emergency Operations Center (EOC) Activation: In the event that the PCHD HEOC, Pima County EOC, or the Tribe's EOC are activated, notification will be provided between the entities of this IGA. Opportunities for coordination and/or representation at the designated EOC shall be provided. The Tribe acknowledges and adopts PCHD's criteria for when a health or environmental event would trigger the activation of the Tribe's EOP.
- i) Strategic National Stockpile (SNS): The SNS is a national repository of antibiotics, antitoxins, life support medications, intravenous administration, airway maintenance supplies, and medical/surgical items. The SNS is designed to supply local public health agencies in the event of a national emergency. The first line of support lies within the immediate response 12-hour "Push Packs." Push Packs are pre-located caches designed to provide rapid delivery of a broad spectrum of assets for an ill-defined threat in the early hours (delivery within 12 hours of request by the state) of an event. If the incident requires additional pharmaceuticals and/or medical supplies, follow-on vendor managed inventory (VMI) supplies will be shipped within 24 to 36 hours. If the agent is well-defined, VMI can be tailored to provide pharmaceuticals, supplies, and/or products specific to the suspected or confirmed agent(s). In this case, the VMI could act as the first option for immediate response from the SNS. In the event of such an incident or event requiring access to the SNS, PYTHSD will request assistance from PCHD.
- j) Health Department Warehouse Inventory and Supply: PCHD will provide PYTHSD with an updated warehouse inventory when requested and provide materials as requested and when available.

4. ENVIRONMENTAL, CHEMICAL, BIOLOGICAL, RADIOBIOLOGICAL, AND NUCLEAR DETECTION/SUPPORT: PYTHSD is the Office of Primary Responsibility for medical surveillance, CBRNE detection, preventive medicine, CBRNE risk assessment and hazard communication for the Tribe. Items listed above will be coordinated with PCHD upon identification by PYTHSD.

5. LABORATORY COORDINATION: The Tribe does not have local capabilities for select agent pathogen identification. PCHD will coordinate the collection and transport of identified specimens to the Arizona State Laboratory upon request. Under terms of this IGA, PYTHSD will assume ability to utilize PCHD-contracted laboratories with Select Agent designation under the CDC. PYTHSD will contact Epidemiology at (520) 724-7797 to coordinate laboratory testing and submission approval to the appropriate lab. Please contact the on-call PCHD epidemiologist after hours and on holidays when needed at (520) 747-5607.

6. SERVICE CENTERS: The Tribe will coordinate with PCHD, for assistance to the local community for the establishment and staffing of service centers and/or shelters. As non-signatory entities, Pima County EOC and the American Red Cross will serve in a support capacity for requested resources. PCHD, within the provisions and scope of this IGA, and in accordance with applicable laws, regulations, and available resources at the time of request, may assist with client registration and surveillance assessments, and



identification of medical needs and first aid during a disaster. Fatality management and family assistance can be coordinated through the Pima County Office of Medical Examiner via PCHD upon need identified.

7. ACCESS TO TRIBAL SOVEREIGN LAND DURING ELEVATED SECURITY: In the event that the Tribe's Reservation is "locked down" due to an increased threat and subsequent elevated security, non-tribal emergency response to the Tribe's Reservation may be hindered during the initial hours of the incident/event. During such an event, the Tribe's EOC Manager will petition/consult the Tribal Council or other authorities for access to the Tribe's Reservation by emergency medical responders, and release of medical responders to aid the local community. Given the nature and scope of such an event, each situation is unique and will require consideration and approval on a case-by-case basis.

8. EFFECTIVE PERIOD: The period of this IGA will become effective April 21, 2021. Either party may request a review of the IGA at any time, if so desired. This IGA will remain in good standing for a period of five years.

9. FINANCING: Each party shall within their lawful method of financing provide for the payment of any costs and expenses associated with their obligations under this IGA. Each party represents that it has within its budget sufficient funds to discharge its obligations and duties under this IGA.

10. OWN ACTS RESPONSIBILITY: Each party shall be responsible for the acts and omissions of itself and its employees, directors, officers and agents. This IGA shall not be construed to create a contractual obligation for either party to indemnify the other for loss or damages resulting from an act or omission of the other party or its employees, directors, officers and agents. This Section shall not constitute a waiver by either party of any right to indemnification, contribution or subrogation which the party may have by operation of law.

11. SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY: Nothing in this IGA shall be assumed to diminish the sovereign immunity of the parties.

12. ANNUAL REVIEW: A review of the provisions of this IGA will occur annually hereafter through the PCHD and PYTHSD. PYTHSD participation will be further reviewed and approved by the Tribal Council through the adoption of a Resolution.

13. TERMINATION: Any party to this IGA may terminate their participation with 30 days written notice to the other party.

14. POINTS-OF-CONTACT: IGA points of contact can be found in **APPENDIX A** (1 page). Should PCHD request the Tribe to provide any off-Reservation coordination, support, response, or service outlined in this IGA, PCHD may contact the Tribe's EOC Manager.

Should PYTHSD request PCHD to provide any County level support, response, or service outlined in this IGA, PYTHSD may contact PCHD.

15. LEGAL JURISDICTION: Nothing in this IGA shall be construed as either limiting or extending the legal jurisdiction of the Tribe or the County. This IGA and all obligations upon the Tribe or the County arising therefrom shall be subject to any limitations of budget law or other applicable local law or regulations.



16. ASSIGNMENT OF RIGHTS: Neither party to this IGA shall assign its rights under this IGA to any other party without written permission from the other party to this IGA.

17. CONSTRUCTION OF AGREEMENT:

- a) Construction and Interpretation. All provisions of this IGA shall be construed to be consistent with the intention of the parties as expressed in the Purpose hereof.
- b) Captions and Headings. The headings used in this IGA are for convenience only and are not intended to affect the meaning of any provision of this agreement.

18. CONFLICT OF INTEREST: This IGA is subject to the provisions of A.R.S. § 38-511, the pertinent provisions of which are incorporated herein by reference.

19. SEVERABILITY: In the event that any provision of this IGA or the application thereof is declared invalid or void by statute or judicial decision, such action shall have no effect on other provisions and their application, which can be given effect without the invalid or void provision or application, and to this extent the provisions of the IGA are severable. In the event that any provision of this IGA is declared invalid or void, the parties agree to meet promptly upon request of the other party in an attempt to reach an agreement on a substitute provision.

20. NO JOINT VENTURE: It is not intended by this IGA, and nothing contained in this IGA shall be construed, to create any partnership, joint venture, or employment relationship between the parties or create any employer-employee relationship between the Tribe and any County employees or between the County and any of the Tribe's employees. Neither party shall be liable for any debts, accounts, obligations or other liabilities whatsoever of the other, including (without limitation) the other party's obligation to withhold Social Security and income taxes for itself or any of its employees.

21. NO THIRD-PARTY BENEFICIARIES: Nothing in the provisions of this IGA is intended to create duties or obligations to or rights in third parties not parties to this IGA or to affect the legal liability of either party to this IGA by imposing any standard of care different from the standard of care imposed by law.

22. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS: The parties shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules, regulations, standards, and executive orders, without limitation to those designated within this IGA.

- a) Anti-Discrimination. To the extent applicable to each party, the provisions of A.R.S. § 41-1463 and Executive Order Number 2009-09 issued by the Governor of the State of Arizona are incorporated by this reference as a part of this IGA.
- b) Americans with Disabilities Act. This IGA is subject to all applicable provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act, Pub. L. 101-336, 42 U.S.C. §§ 12101, 12213, and all applicable federal regulations under the Act, including 28 CFR Parts 35 and 36.

23. LEGAL ARIZONA WORKERS ACT:

- a) The parties hereby warrant that they will at all times during the term of this IGA comply with all federal immigration laws applicable to the employment of its employees, and with all applicable requirements of A.R.S. § 23-214(A) (together the "State and Federal Immigration Laws"). The



parties shall further ensure that each subcontractor who performs any work under this IGA likewise complies with the State and Federal Immigration Laws.

- b) Pursuant to A.R.S. § 41-4401, each party shall have the right at any time to inspect the books and records of the other party and any subcontractor, as they pertain to this IGA, in order to verify such party's compliance with all applicable State and Federal Immigration Laws.
- c) To inspect the books and records specified in subsection (b) above, one party shall send a written request to the other party. The party may then choose to allow a courtesy inspection of the relevant books and records at a time and date of the party's choosing in recognition of the other party's obligations under A.R.S. § 41-4401.
- d) Any breach of a party or any subcontractor's warranty of compliance with applicable State and Federal Immigration Laws shall be deemed a material breach of this IGA, which can result in the termination of this IGA.
- e) Either party's failure to provide a courtesy inspection of its relevant books and records shall not be deemed a material breach of this IGA, but may result in termination of this agreement, at the other party's election.
- f) The parties shall advise each subcontractor of the other party's rights, and the subcontractor's obligations, under this Section by including a provision in each subcontract substantially in the following form:

"Subcontractor hereby warrants that it will at all times during the term of this Contract comply with all federal immigration laws applicable to Subcontractor's employees, and with the requirements of A.R.S. § 23-214(A), as applicable. Subcontractor further agrees that the County and/or Tribe may inspect the Subcontractor's books and records to ensure that Subcontractor is in compliance with these requirements. Any breach of this paragraph by Subcontractor will be deemed to be a material breach of this Contract subjecting Contractor to penalties up to and including suspension or termination of this Contract."

Should a subcontract be suspended or terminated due to subcontractor's material breach, at the contracting party's election, the contracting party shall retain a replacement subcontractor as soon as possible so as not to delay project completion or may self-perform the services that would have been provided under the subcontract.

24. COUNTERPARTS: This IGA may be executed in two or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument. The signature pages from one or more counterpart may be removed from such counterpart and attached to a single instrument.

25. AMENDMENT: The parties may modify, amend, alter or extend this IGA only by a written amendment signed by the parties.



26. ENTIRE AGREEMENT: This instrument constitutes the entire agreement between the parties pertaining to the subject matter hereof, and all prior or contemporaneous agreements and understandings, oral or written, are hereby superseded and merged herein. Any exhibits to this IGA are incorporated herein by this reference.

27. APPROVAL: As part of the approval process, this IGA will be coordinated with the Tribe initially and with PYTHSD annually thereafter.

28. AUTHORITY: The signatories affirm that they have the authority to bind their respective parties to this IGA.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the County has caused this IGA to be executed by the Pima County Board of Supervisors, as attested to by the Clerk of the Board, and the Tribe has caused this IGA to be executed by the Chairman of the Tribe, upon adoption of a Resolution by the Tribal Council.
