To the Pima County Board of Supervisors,

The ELDER Alliance is a broad collation of more than 70 non-profit organizations, businesses, government agencies, community partners and residents. The alliance has established a strong system to support the rapidly growing older adult population, allowing people to stay healthy longer, remain active, involved, and maintain maximum independence.

The ELDER Alliance strongly supports implementation of a Home Sharing Program in Southern Arizona. Affordable housing for older adults was scarce before the COVID19 pandemic, and the stock shortage has risen to crisis levels because of it. In addition, people have become socially isolated, lonely, and depressed as secondary ill effects. Home Sharing is a unique opportunity to address multiple adversities for many individuals, including cost burden and social isolation. This is a sustainable housing option that allows older adults to age in place and can provide both household assistance and caregiving. A home sharing relationship is built on selective, safe process and is beneficial to both the homeowner and home seeker.

We urge you to support funding for this pilot program. The concept has gained much traction all over the country. Given the size of our aging population in Pima County, we have the opportunity to create a scalable model right here at home.
