> #15 JobPath, Inc.

> Pima County Board of Supervisors for the period 2013-2021 has supported JobPath, Inc. for professional services, contracts and grant funding in the amount of \$6,002,000. Supervisors are now considering an additional \$1,000,000 in funds from the ARPA funds for the period 2021-2022. JobPath, Inc. has a new CEO and provides a new positive projected growth plan although unrealistic. JobPath, Inc. cannot be expected to almost double the individuals currently served to the proposed 670 (not 1,000). It is a major challenge and a burden on JobPath, Inc. to expect this growth within 1 year. I request you deny this additional \$1,000,000 from the CARE funds and pursue other opportunities to spend this money within Pima County for projects that have a reasonable goal of attainment within the identified time period of one year.

I request the following Agenda and Addendum comments become part of the Agenda comments for the Board of Supervisors Meeting of Tuesday July 6, 2021.

Item 12 Election Integrity Commission Prior to any additional members being appointed to this Commission which has not met for some time it would behoove the Board of Supervisors to determine which tasks the committee is responsible for. Past performance gives little reason for the commission to exist.

Item 14. Relief of taxes for Lifelong Learning Research Institute. The parcels in question are not owned by Lifelong Learning, a defunct charter school, so under what authority would tax relief be granted?

Item 15. Additional funding to JobPath, Inc. While additional reporting requirements have been requested it is too early to evaluate the program's success in expanding student participation or the new CEO's performance. To approve an additional ONE MILLION DOLLARS toward this program which has been waning without further oversight on the Board of Supervisor's part is a dereliction of your fiduciary responsibility. It also should be noted of 370 students almost two-thirds live in the City of Tucson which is providing a mere \$185,000 to JobPath. Other communities provide no monies. I request you deny this additional \$1,000,000 from the CARE funds. This money could be spend more wisely within Pima County.

Item 16. Extend contract term and reduce contract amount on the Lease-Purchase Agreement for World View Enterprises, Inc., 1805 E. Aerospace Parkway.

Pima County and World View Enterprises entered entered into the lease-purchase agreement as an economic-development activity in 2016. It is not wise to reward corporations for mismanagement. The County is fulfilling terms of the contract and World View should also. I request you deny a decrease in the contract amount.

I look forward to in-person meetings resuming soon.
