### \*Title:

P15RZ00009 MAGEE COMO DEVELOPMENT ASSOC. LLC - N. LA CHOLLA BOULEVARD REZONING

### \*Introduction/Background:

Applicant requests a five-year time extension for the rezoning from TR (Transistional) to the CB-2 (General Business) zone. The rezoning was approved in 2015 and expired February 2, 2021. The site is located approximately 150 feet north of W. Magee Road and 600 feet west of N. La Cholla Boulevard, on parcel code 225-44-5470.

### \*Discussion:

The applicant cites the need for a five-year time extension to investigate the market and design uses within Magee Center II.

### \*Conclusion:

The proposed retail-commercial use remains a suitable land use for the area. The recommended original and modified conditions updates certain conditions to current standard language and policy treatment. The time extension will allow a total of 10 years from the original Board of Supervisors approval to complete rezoning conditions.

### \*Recommendation:

Staff recommends APPROVAL of a five-year time extension subject to original and modified standard and special conditions.

### **REZONING TIME EXTENSION**

### P15RZ00009 MAGEE COMO DEVELOPMENT ASSOC. LLC – N. LA CHOLLA BOULEVARD REZONING

Magee Como Development Assoc. LLC, represented by Craig Courtney, requests a five-year time extension for an approximately .88-acre rezoning (Magee Center II, Lot 4, Seq #20193260717) from the TR (Transitional) to the CB-2 (General Business) zone, located approximately 150 feet north of W. Magee Road and 600 feet west of N. La Cholla Boulevard, addressed as 7791 N. La Cholla Boulevard. The subject site was rezoned in 2015 and the rezoning expired on February 2, 2021. Staff recommends APPROVAL OF A FIVE-YEAR TIME EXTENSION SUBJECT TO ORIGINAL AND MODIFIED STANDARD AND SPECIAL CONDITIONS.

### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends **APPROVAL** of a five-year time extension to February 2, 2026 as per the applicant's request for an approximately .88-acre rezoning from TR (Transitional) to the CB-2 (General Business) zone, subject to original and modified standard and special conditions as follows:

### 4. The owner shall:

- A. Submit a development plan if determined necessary by the appropriate County agencies.
- B. Record the necessary development related covenants as determined appropriate by the various County agencies.
- C. Provide development related assurances as required by the appropriate agencies.

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D. Submit a title report (current to within 60 days) evidencing ownership of the property prior to the preparation of the development-related covenants and any required dedications.

- 21. There shall be no further lot splitting or subdividing of residential development without the written approval of the Board of Supervisors.
- <u>32.</u> Transportation condition: The property shall be limited to the existing access points on Magee Road.
- 4<u>3</u>. Regional Flood Control District conditions: <u>First flush retention shall be provided in Low Impact Development practices distributed throughout the site.</u>
  - A. First flush retention (retention of the first ½ inch-of-rainfall) shall-be-provided for all newly disturbed and impervious surfaces. This requirement shall be made a condition of the Site Construction Permit.
  - B. On-site retention/detention shall be provided.
- 54. Regional Wastewater Reclamation conditions:
  - A. The owner(s) shall not construe any action by Pima County as a commitment to provide sewer service to any new development within the rezoning area until Pima County executes an agreement with the owner(s) to that effect.
  - B. The owner(s) shall obtain written documentation from the Pima County Regional Wastewater Reclamation Department (PCRWRD) that treatment and conveyance capacity is available for any new development within the rezoning area, no more than 90 days before submitting any rezoning, tentative plat, development plan, preliminary sewer layout, sewer improvement plan, or request for building permit for review. Should treatment and/or conveyance capacity not be available at that time, the owner(s) shall enter into a written agreement addressing the option of funding, designing and constructing the necessary improvements to Pima County's public sewerage system at his or her sole expense or cooperatively with other affected parties. All such improvements shall be designed and constructed as directed by the PCRWRD.
  - C. The owner(s) shall time all new development within the rezoning area to coincide with the availability of treatment and conveyance capacity in the downstream public sewerage system.
  - D. The owner(s) shall connect all development within the rezoning area to Pima County's public sewer system at the location and in the manner specified by the PCRWRD in its capacity response letter and as specified by PCRWRD at the time of review of the tentative plat, development plan, preliminary sewer layout, sewer construction plan, or request for building permit.
  - E. The owners(s) shall fund, design and construct all off-site and on-site sewers necessary to serve the rezoning area, in the manner specified at the time of review of the tentative plat, development plan, preliminary sewer layout, sewer construction plan or request for building permit.
  - EF. The owner(s) shall complete the construction of all necessary public and/or private sewerage facilities as required by all applicable agreements with Pima County, and all applicable regulations, including the Clean Water Act and those promulgated by ADEQ, before treatment and conveyance capacity in the downstream public sewerage system will be permanently committed for any new development within the rezoning area.
- 65. Environmental Planning condition: Upon the effective date of the Ordinance, the owner(s) shall have a continuing responsibility to remove buffelgrass (Pennisetum ciliare) from the property. Acceptable methods of removal include chemical treatment, physical removal, or other known effective means of removal. This obligation also transfers to any future

owners of property within the rezoning site and Pima County may enforce this rezoning condition against the property owner. Prior to issuance of the certificate of compliance, the owner(s) shall record a covenant, to run with the land, memorializing the terms of this condition.

- 76. Cultural Resources condition: In the event that human remains, including human skeletal remains, cremations, and/or ceremonial objects and funerary objects are found during excavation or construction, ground disturbing activities must cease in the immediate vicinity of the discovery. State laws ARS 41-865 and ARS 41-844, require that the Arizona State Museum be notified of the discovery at (520) 621-4795 so that cultural groups who claim cultural or religious affinity to them can make appropriate arrangements for the repatriation and reburial of the remains. The human remains will be removed from the site by a professional archaeologist pending consultation and review by the Arizona State Museum and the concerned cultural groups.
- 87. Adherence to the preliminary development plan as approved at public hearing. (Exhibit B) 98. The uses of the property are limited to restaurants with/without a bar and CB-1 zone uses except for automotive related uses, drive-thru restaurants, and stand-alone bars.
- 109. In the event the subject property is annexed, the property owner shall adhere to all applicable rezoning conditions, including, but not limited to, development conditions which require financial contributions to, or construction of infrastructure, including without limitation, transportation, flood control, or sewer facilities.
- The property owner shall execute and record the following disclaimer regarding the Private Property Rights Protection Act:- Proposition 207 rights. "Property Owner acknowledges that neither the rezoning of the Property nor the conditions of rezoning give Property Owner any rights, claims or causes of action under the Private Property Rights Protection Act (Arizona Revised Statutes Title 12, chapter 8, article 2.1). To the extent that the rezoning or conditions of rezoning may be construed to give Property Owner any rights or claims under the Private Property Rights Protection Act, Property Owner hereby waives any and all such rights and/or claims pursuant to A.R.S. § 12-1134(I)."

As part of the current Development Services Department standard practice, condition #'s 1A-D as listed in Ordinance 2016-32 are recommended for deletion to reduce redundant requirements and ease processes.

The Department of Transportation's original condition is renumbered as condition #2 and there are no additions or deletions to transportation's conditions.

Regional Flood Control District's original conditions are being deleted and a condition is being added regarding first flush retention to provide distribution throughout the site and is listed as condition #3.

Regional Wastewater Reclamation has provided minor adjustments to their original rezoning conditions and added a condition to meet current standard conditions. The updated conditions are renumbered as #4A-F.

The recommended modifications to conditions do not constitute a substantial change, which would require review by the Planning and Zoning Commission.

### STAFF REPORT:

Staff supports a five-year time extension request, which if approved, will provide a total of 10 years from the original Board of Supervisors approval to complete the rezoning conditions. Because of the continued appropriateness of the P15RZ00009 rezoning, including the rezoning

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conditions and the preliminary development plan layout, staff supports the time extension. Additionally, the rezoning supports the goals and policy of the Neighborhood Activity Center (NAC) land use designation and has minimal impact on the adjacent neighborhood. A five-year time extension will provide a new case expiration date of February 2, 2026.

The applicant cites delays due to the need to amend the Magee Center Final Plat to establish Magee Center II, Lots 1-6, which was approved by the Board of Supervisors on November 19, 2019. Currently Lots 3, 5, and 6 have sufficient time periods to investigate the market and design uses within Magee Center; with Lot 4 rezoning expired, a time extension is needed.

The subject property, known as Lot 4 of Magee Center II (Seq. #20193260717), is located north of W. Magee Road, approximately 600 feet west of N. La Cholla Boulevard. The .88-acre rezoning from TR to the CB-2 zone was approved by the Board of Supervisors on February 2, 2016 and the Board subsequently adopted ordinance 2016-32 memorializing the standard and special conditions. The approved preliminary development plan provides for a 25,000 square-foot two-story building (12,500 square-foot footprint) with permitted uses limited by Rezoning Policy RP-146 (restaurant with/without a bar and CB-1 zoning uses except for automotive related uses, drive-through restaurants and stand-alone bars). The policy will be implemented through renumbered condition #8.

The CB-2 rezoning is compliant with the NAC plan designation. The objective of the NAC designation is to provide convenience goods and services within or near suburban residential neighborhoods for day-to-day living needs without attracting vehicle trips from outside the immediate service area. NAC may include a mix of medium density housing types and commercial uses.

The property is not located within the Maeveen Marie Behan Conservation Lands System nor is located within a comprehensive plan-identified growth area. The rezoning promotes the Growing Smarter acts by the compact, mixed use planning of adjacent residential uses with the proposed limited commercial uses. The Magee Road improvements provide an opportunity for the expansion and establishment of a cohesive, compatible, neighborhood-scale development suitable to the surrounding business and residential area. Multi-model forms of transportation include a Sun Tran bus stop adjacent to the subject property and walking paths nearby. The Magee Road improvements have provided adequate infrastructure including sidewalk connectivity to nearby residences, businesses, and community services. This is a prime locale and a good infill project for an existing, diverse neighborhood.

Denial of the time extension will cause the site to revert to TR zoning, which would conform to the NAC plan designation. Closure of the rezoning would not preclude the possibility of a future CB-2 rezoning.

### TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT

In the vicinity of the site, improvements have been recently completed for Magee Road and La Cholla Boulevard by the County Capital Improvement Projects 4MMLIC and 4RTLTM-4LCIMR and there are no additional scheduled roadway projects. The most recent traffic count for Magee Road is 19,338 Average Daily Trip (ADT) with an approximate capacity of 33,830 ADT. The most recent traffic count for La Cholla Boulevard is 21, 570 ADT with an approximate capacity of 53,920 ADT.

No change to the approved Preliminary Development Plan or land uses are proposed. Given the current traffic counts and roadway capacity, there is capacity to accommodate the traffic to be generated by the site. Therefore, there are no concurrency concerns with this request.

The Department of Transportation has no objection to this rezoning time extension and no modifications nor additions to rezoning conditions are proposed. The Department of Transportation condition is renumbered as condition #2.

### REGIONAL FLOOD CONTROL DISTRICT

The District has reviewed the site conditions and advises that Floodplain and Regulated Riparian Habitat does not impact the site.

The Pima County Regional Flood Control District has no objection subject to removing the existing Regional Flood Control District conditions in Ordinance 2016-32 and replacing with renumbered condition #3 for this time extension.

### REGIONAL WASTEWATER RECLAMATION DEPARTMENT

The Planning Section of the Pima County Regional Wastewater Reclamation Department (PCRWRD) has no objection to the request for the rezoning time extension but recommends the existing PCRWRD conditions in Ordinance 2016-32 be replaced with updated conditions. The updated rezoning conditions are provided in renumbered conditions #4A-F.

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There are two 8-inch public sewer mains located on the property. The owner is advised to submit a Type I capacity request for investigative approval regarding sewer service availability. No such request was previously submitted to PCRWRD for review or approval.

### UNITED STATES FISH AND WILDLIFE SERVICE

United States Fish and Wildlife Service has no comment.

### **TUCSON ELECTRIC POWER**

Tucson Electric Power has no comment.

### METRO WATER DISTRICT

Metro Water District has no comment.

### **GOLDER RANCH FIRE DISTRICT**

Golder Ranch Fire District has no additional comments.

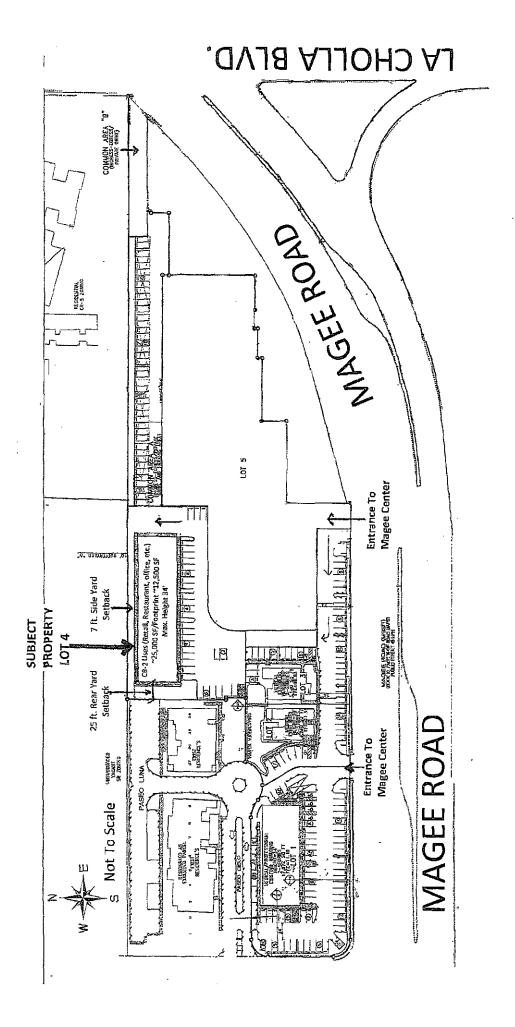

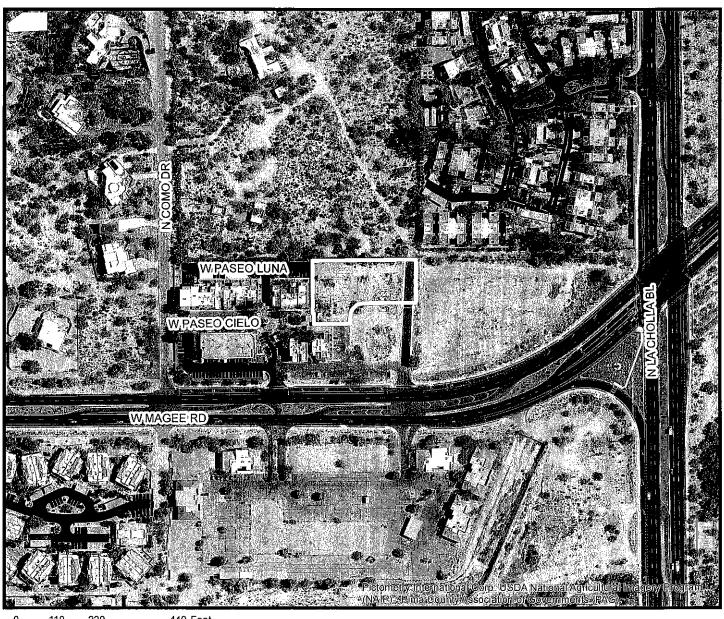

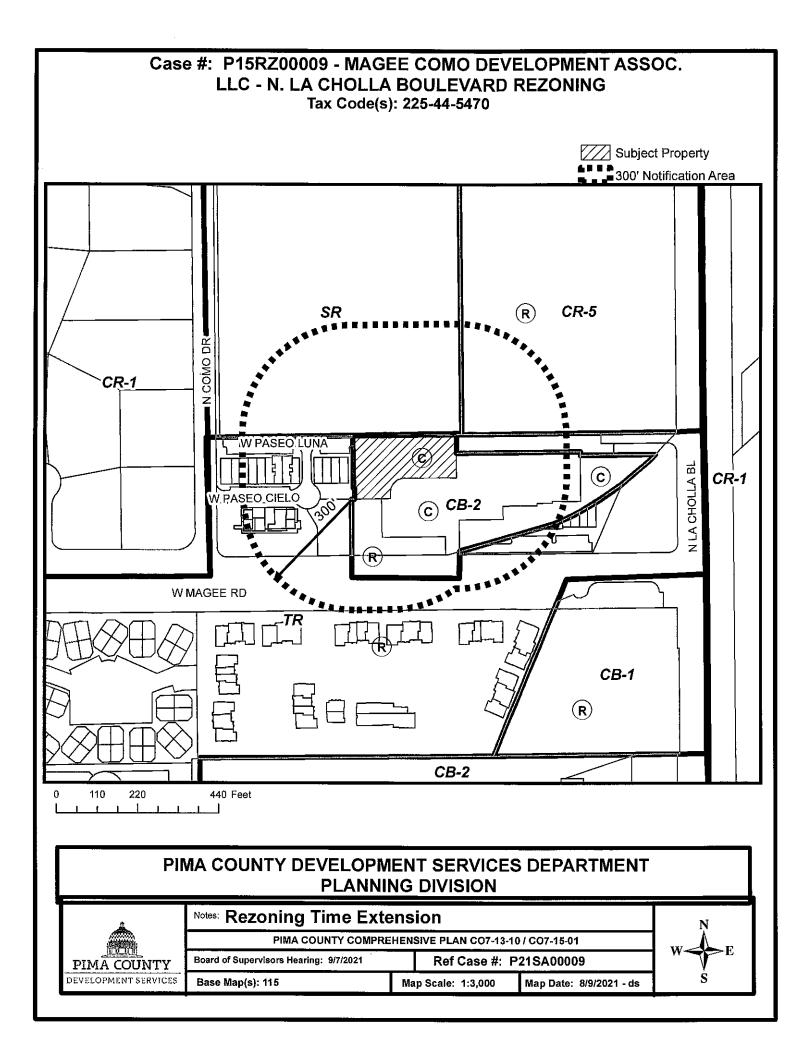

### **Neighborhood Activity Center (NAC)**

Objective: To designate lower intensity mixed use areas designed to provide goods and services within or near residential neighborhoods for day-to-day and weekly living needs. Neighborhood Activity Centers provide lower-intensity commercial services. For example a grocery market may be the principle anchor tenant along with other neighborhood services, such as a drugstore, variety/hardware store, self-service laundry, and bank. The center may include a mix of medium-density housing types. Neighborhood Activity Centers are generally less than 25 acres in size. Larger centers provide opportunity for a mix of intensive non-residential uses and medium-density residential uses, and are to be located on arterials. Smaller mixed use centers may contain medium density residential uses and may be located along collector or arterial streets. All centers will have direct pedestrian and bicycle access to the surrounding neighborhoods. Individual rezoning requests do not necessarily have to be a mixed use project; however, the application must demonstrate how the project serves to create or enhance the mixed use character of the designated activity center as a whole.

- Residential Gross Density: (if applicable) Minimum- 5 RAC; Maximum- 12 RAC
- Residential Gross Densities for TDR Receiving Areas: Minimum- 5 RAC; Maximum- 8 RAC

Please accept this letter as our application for a "Time Extension Request" for Lot 4's Rezoning Case # P15RZ0009, Ordinance 2016 – 32 recorded in Seq. # 20161620543. We would like to request the time extension be granted for 5 years through February 2, 2026. To assist you in evaluating our request, I have included the following information for easy reference.

### I. OWNERSHIP AND LETTER OF AUTHORIZATION:

- A. Magee Como Development Association, LLC, an Arizona limited liability company is a Manager Managed company. The Manager Member is Craig R. Courtney (520-247-3306) and the other Member is Michael G. Byrne (520-307-1290) at 5151 N. Oracle Rd., Ste 210, Tucson, Az. 85704.
- B. The Company's "Letter of Authorization" is attached. It appoints both Craig R. Courtney and Michael G. Byrne as its agents for this request.

### II. PROPERTY DESCRIPTION:

### A. Zoning:

Lot 4, an .88-acre parcel located at the northwest corner of Magee Road and La Cholla Boulevard, was rezoned to CB-2 (General Business) with conditions referenced in Ordinance 2016 – 32 recorded in Seq. # 20161620543 (See attached Zoning Ordinance - Exhibit "A"),

Zoning Case Files (See Page 5 of Exhibit "A"):

- 1) Co 7 15 01, and
- 2) P15RZ0009,

### B. Final Plat:

Magee Center's Final Plat II for Lots 1-6 and Common Areas A and B (Private Streets, Utilities, Drainage, and Parking) was recently re-platted to include Lot 6, (See Final Re-Plat - Exhibit "B")

Final Plat Case Files - Not noted in the Rezoning Case above.

- 1) P16R200004,
- 2) Co20-02-004,
- 3) P1202-049.
- 4) P1202-015, and
- 5) P18FP0029,

### C. Development Plan:

The Development Plan for Magee Center-Revision 1 (See attached approved Development Plan - Exhibit "C") was approved on December 18, 2003 and covered Lots 1, 2 and 3 of Magee Center.

Development Plan Case Files - Not noted in the Rezoning Case or the Magee Center II Final Plat above.

- 3) Co 10(3)02 51,
- D. Assessor's Record Map Lot 4 -Tax Code # 225-44-547 (See attached Map Exhibit "D").

### III. CIRCUMSTANCES CREATING DELAY IN MEETING INITIAL TIME EXTENSION:

- A. This rezoning was completed in early February 2016 and was one of the remaining parcels along with Magee Center's Lots 3 and 5 and the Remnant Parcel that would be combined to be the northwest corner of Magee Road and La Cholla Blvd. In order to complete the rezoning conditions for Lot 4 its interior design needed to be integrated into a Development Concept Permit Plan that included the existing pad on Lot 3 and the approved building envelopes on Lot 5.
- B. Before Lot 4's zoning requirements could be met the Magee Center Final Plat needed to be amended to include the Remnant Parcel as Lot 6 of Magee Center, since it consists of all of the frontage property along Magee Road east of the Magee Center Main entrance. This Replat established Magee Center II, Lots 1 through 6 and was approved by the Pima County Board of Supervisors on November 19, 2019 and recorded November 22, 2019 in Seq # 201932660717, Pages 1-3.
- C. Once the Replat was finalized a time extension was still needed to extend Lot 5's zoning conditions as well. Delays due to the health issues and related problems affecting the commercial real estate market in 2019 and 2020, it was not until August 2020 that Lot 5's time extension was approved through October 2023.
- D. Since Lot 6 still retained the prior zoning before Lots 3,4, and 5 were rezoned to business uses, it needed to be rezoned to a commercial use so that this entire corner could be designed as a retail center. This was completed in January 2021.
- E. Except for Lot 4, Lots 3, 5 and 6 all have sufficient time periods to investigate the market and design uses within Magee Center that will be accepted in the marketplace.

### IV.TIME EXTENSION REQUEST AND CLARIFICATION OF ZONING CONDITION # 4:

- A. A 5-year time extension ending February 2, 2026, and
- B. A separate letter from Regional Flood Control District that Condition # 4 can be meet by including Lot 4 in the drainage plan requirements for Lots 5's and 6's zoning conditions.

### V. SITE PLAN.

The site plan in Lot 4's original Rezoning Case shall serve as the applicant's site plan requirement.

### **ORDINANCE 2016-32**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF PIMA COUNTY. ARIZONA; RELATING TO ZONING; REZONING LOT 4 OF MAGEE CENTER (BOOK 56 AND PAGE 94), AN APPROXIMATELY .88 ACRES OF PROPERTY (PARCEL CODE 225-44-5470) FROM THE TR (TRANSITIONAL) ZONE TO THE CB-2 (GENERAL BUSINESS) ZONE, IN CASE P15RZ00009 MAGEE COMO DEVELOPMENT ASSOCIATION, LLC - NORTH LA CHOLLA BOULEVARD REZONING, LOCATED APPROXIMATELY 150 FEET NORTH OF WEST MAGEE ROAD AND 600 FEET WEST OF NORTH LA CHOLLA BOULEVARD, AND AMENDING PIMA COUNTY ZONING MAP NO. 115.

### IT IS ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF PIMA COUNTY, ARIZONA:

Section 1. The .88 acres located 150 feet north of Magee Road and 600 feet west of La Cholla Boulevard (Lot 4 of Magee Center) and illustrated by the shaded area on the attached rezoning ordinance map (Exhibit A), which amends Pima County Zoning Map No. 115, is rezoned from the TR (Transitional) zone to the CB-2 (General Business) zone subject to the conditions in this ordinance.

### Section 2. Rezoning conditions.

- The owner shall:
  - A. Submit a development plan if determined necessary by the appropriate County agencies.
  - B. Record the necessary development related covenants as determined appropriate by the various County agencies.
  - Provide development related assurances as required by the appropriate agencies.
  - D. Submit a title report (current to within 60 days) evidencing ownership of the property prior to the preparation of the development related covenants and any required dedications.
- There shall be no further lot splitting or subdividing of residential development without 2. the written approval of the Board of Supervisors.
- 3. Transportation condition: The property shall be limited to the existing access points on Magee Road.
- Regional Flood Control District conditions: 4.
  - A. First flush retention (retention of the first 1/2 inch of rainfall) shall be provided for all newly disturbed and impervious surfaces. This requirement shall be made a condition of the Site Construction Permit.
  - B. On-site retention/detention shall be provided.

- 5. Regional Wastewater Reclamation conditions:
  - A. The owner shall not construe any action by Pima County as a commitment to provide sewer service to any new development within the rezonling area until Pima County executes an agreement with the owner to that effect.
  - B. The owner shall obtain written documentation from the Pima County Regional Wastewater Reclamation Department (PCRWRD) that treatment and conveyance capacity is available for any new development within the rezoning area, no more than 90 days before submitting any tentative plat, development plan, preliminary sewer layout, sewer improvement plan, or request for building permit for review. Should treatment and/or conveyance capacity not be available at that time, the owner shall enter into a written agreement addressing the option of funding, designing and constructing the necessary improvements to Pima County's public sewerage system at his or her sole expense or cooperatively with other affected parties. All such improvements shall be designed and constructed as directed by the PCRWRD.
  - C. The owner shall time all new development within the rezoning area to coincide with the availability of treatment and conveyance capacity in the downstream public sewerage system.
  - D. The owner shall connect all development within the rezoning area to Pima County's public sewer system at the location and in the manner specified by the PCRWRD in its capacity response letter and as specified by PCRWRD at the time of review of the tentative plat, development plan, preliminary sewer layout, sewer construction plan, or request for building permit.
  - E. The owner shall complete the construction of all necessary public and/or private sewerage facilities as required by all applicable agreements with Pima County, and all applicable regulations, including the Clean Water Act and those promulgated by ADEQ, before treatment and conveyance capacity in the downstream public sewerage system will be permanently committed for any new development within the rezoning area.
- 6. Environmental Planning condition: Upon the effective date of the Ordinance, the owner(s) shall have a continuing responsibility to remove buffelgrass (Pennisetum ciliare) from the property. Acceptable methods of removal include chemical treatment, physical removal, or other known effective means of removal. This obligation also transfers to any future owners of property within the rezoning site and Pima County may enforce this rezoning condition against the property owner. Prior to issuance of the certificate of compliance, the owner(s) shall record a covenant, to run with the land, memorializing the terms of this condition.
- 7. Cultural Resources condition: In the event that human remains, including human skeletal remains, cremations, and/or ceremonial objects and funerary objects are found during excavation or construction, ground disturbing activities must cease in the immediate vicinity of the discovery. State laws ARS 41-865 and ARS 41-844, require that the Arizona State Museum be notified of the discovery at (520) 621-4795 so that cultural groups who claim cultural or religious affinity to them can make appropriate arrangements for the repatriation and reburial of the remains. The human remains will be removed from the site by a professional archaeologist pending consultation and review by the Arizona State Museum and the concerned cultural groups.

- 8. Adherence to the preliminary development plan as approved at public hearing. (Exhibit B)
- 9. The uses of the property are limited to restaurants with/without a bar and CB-1 zone uses except for automotive related uses, drive-thru restaurants, and stand-alone bars.
- 10. In the event the subject property is annexed, the property owner shall adhere to all applicable rezoning conditions, including, but not limited to, development conditions which require financial contributions to, or construction of infrastructure, including without limitation, transportation, flood control, or sewer facilities.
- 11. The property owner shall execute and record the following disclaimer regarding Proposition 207 rights. "Property Owner acknowledges that neither the rezoning of the Property nor the conditions of rezoning give Property Owner any rights, claims or causes of action under the Private Property Rights Protection Act (Arizona Revised Statutes Title 12, chapter 8, article 2.1). To the extent that the rezoning or conditions of rezoning may be construed to give Property Owner any rights or claims under the Private Property Rights Protection Act, Property Owner hereby waives any and all such rights and/or claims pursuant to A.R.S. § 12-1134(i)."

Section 3. Time limits of conditions. Conditions 1 through 11 of Section 2 shall be completed no later than February 2, 2021.

Section 4. The rezoning conditions of Section 2 may be amended or waived by resolution of the Board of Supervisors in accordance with Chapter 18.91 of the Plma County Zoning Code.

Section 5. The effective date of this Ordinance is the date the Chair of the Board of Supervisors signs this Ordinance.

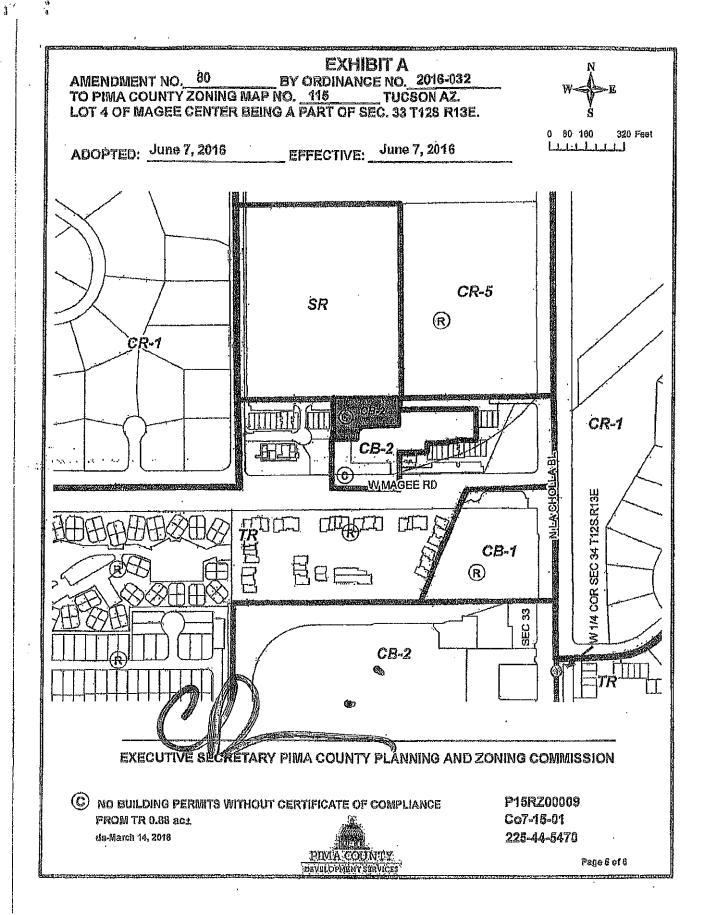

## FINAL PLAT FOR MAGE CENTER II, LOTS 1-6 AND COMMON AREAS A AND B

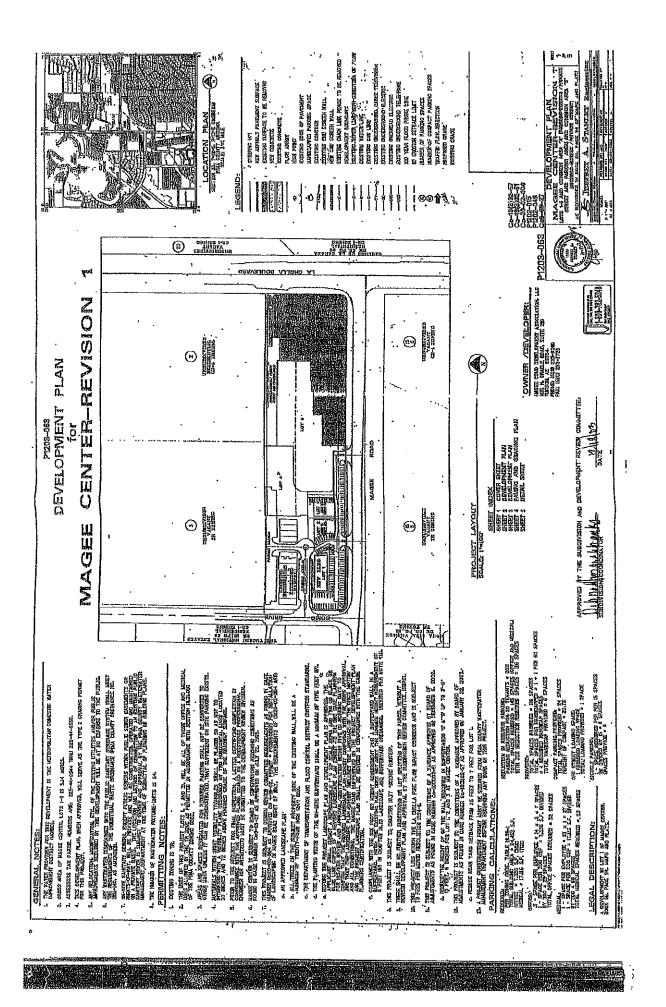
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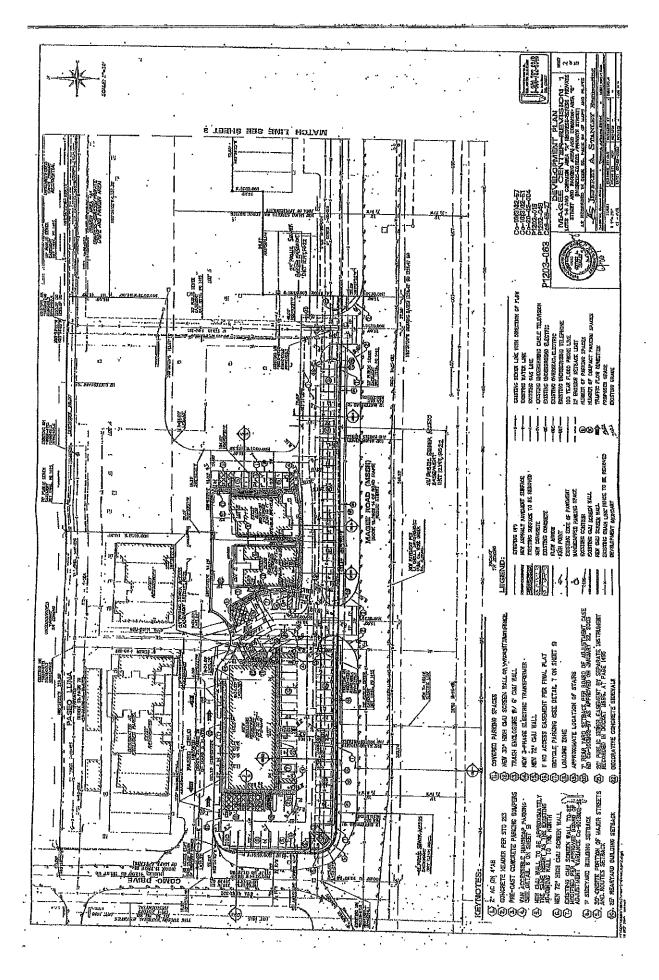


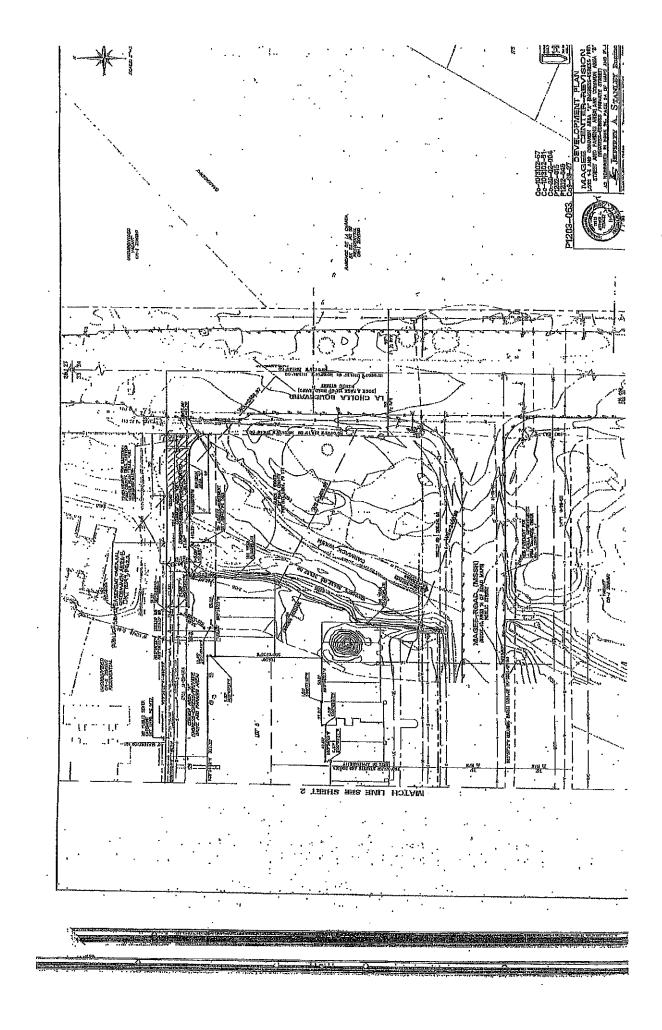


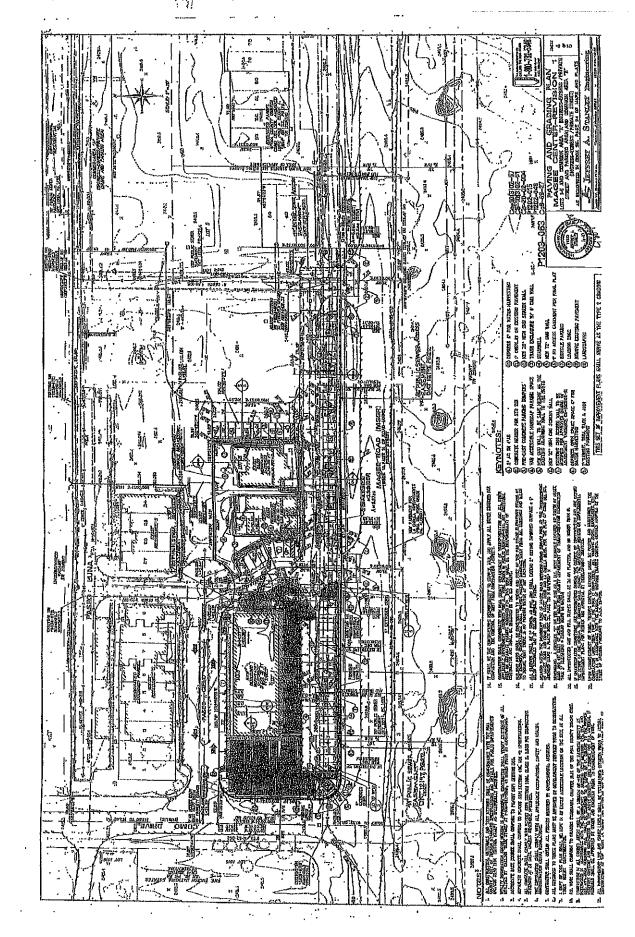


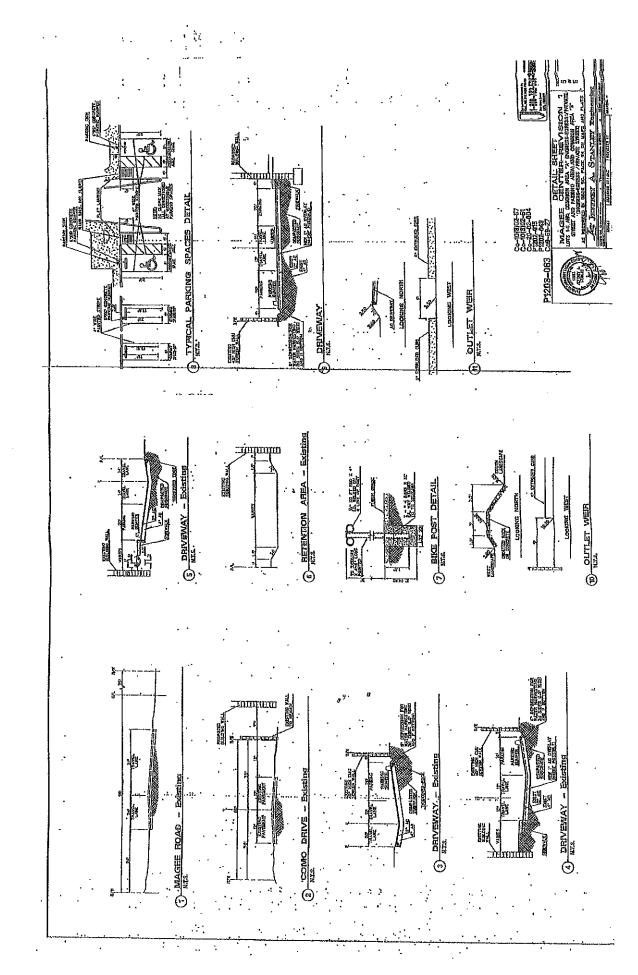
### EXHIBIT "C" APPROVED DEVELOPMENT PLAN









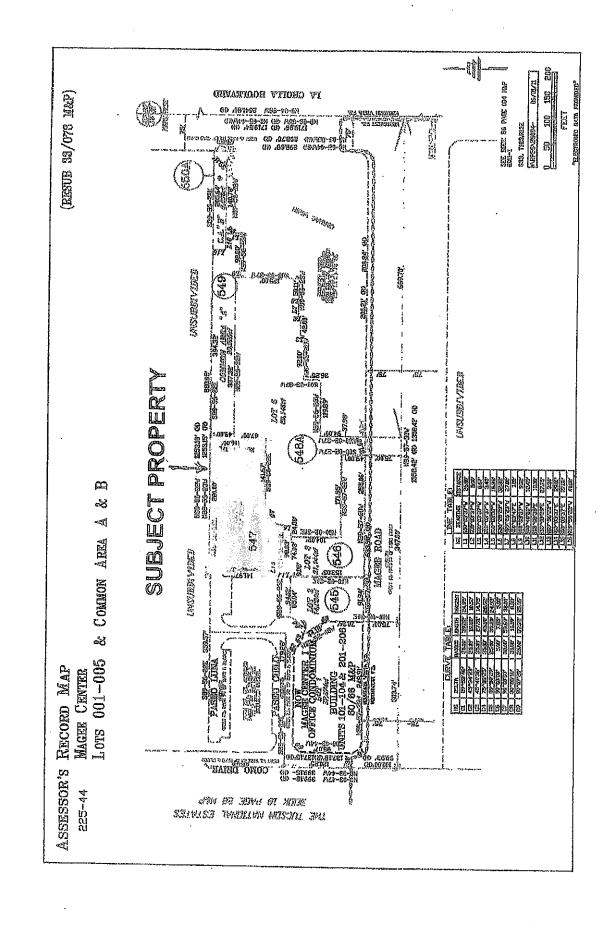
