To the Pima County Board of Supervisors,

I am citizen living with a Tucson address outside of city limits. I have been registered to vote since turning 18 yrs of age and have voted in every election since. With the exception of two occasions, I have always voted on the day of election in my assigned precinct.

My request is that we have more precincts not less with fewer people in each precinct. We should have no more than 1,250 people per precinct given that a precinct committeemen is assigned 125 fellow citizens in their precinct. This would allow for 10 precinct committeemen per precinct. To have more than 1,250 people per precinct is to create undue stress on the precinct committeemen to service a precinct, create disorder and confusion upon the poll workers of a precinct to meet the needs of citizens voting in massive numbers, and acts as a form of voter suppression requiring long massive lines resulting in hours of waiting to cast a vote if not to outright discourage people from voting.

It is my prayer that reason, logic, and good old common sense will prevail to act upon my suggestion and not to move forward with this foolish idea of creating mass chaos by engaging in precinct consolidation.

This comment is requested to be read into RECORD at your next Pima County Board of Supervisors Meeting:

I have been a Poll Worker and Inspector in the polls since 2003. It is from this viewpoint that I make my comments. The proposal from the Pima County Elections Department recommends decreasing the number of voting precincts in our county from 249 to 205. This will impact almost 190,000 voters and is a decrease of 31% county wide, with District 1 at a 38%

decrease and District 5 at a 25% decrease. I see this as a possible Inspector's nightmare. Given the following:

Many irregularities during 2020 that need improving (10% of my voters were surprised to find out they were mailed a ballot. They ALWAYS vote in person on Election Day);
New voting laws coming down from the AZ Legislature;

- A once every 10 year Redistricting effort reconfiguring LD's and possibly precincts causing confusion;

- Continued heightened attention paid to Arizona's voting practices;

- Fewer mail in ballot voters as citizens want to vote in person to make sure their vote is counted as cast and remove themselves from PEVL;

Increased oversight over mail in ballots that get dropped off in the precincts;
And, increased registered voter participation in hotly contested State and Federal level races;

I am advocating for the same number or smaller number of precincts. This is to ensure that poll workers can manage the integrity of the election process by serving the voters in a personal and trustworthy fashion. In addition, Precinct Committeemen can cut down on the number of Provisional Ballots by making sure that the voters are prepared by checking their registrations ahead of time and by making sure that voters go to the correct place to vote.
