Dear Ms. Manriquez,

This letter and packet of supporting documentation is in follow-up to my email sent to you in June regarding forgiveness of past property taxes.

We had a change in staffing in 2019. Fr Paul Coury was the Director of the Redemptorist Renewal Center and was reassigned to St Mary's of the Assumption in Whittier California. He was replaced by Fr Anthony Nguyen. Apparently notification of filing for the Exemption got lost in the personnel shuffle. It was also discovered that the mailing address on file with the Assessor's office was for a PO Box that was closed nearly 10 years ago.

It was only discovered in June that the filings had not be completed. Prior to these two years we have been in good standing with the Assessor's office. Always being granted exemption because we are a religious ministry.

This exemption keeps our ministry a float. Were it not for this exemption we simply could not afford to be open. Due to the pandemic our gifts/donations and retreat income were down 38.3%. Between March of 2020 and May of 2021 we laid off the majority of our staff. Three of our staff members including myself continued to work without compensation (other than the two PPP loan periods) in an effort to keep the ministry alive. We are asking forgiveness for the 2019 and 2020 years. I have filed albeit late the exemption request for 2021 with the Assessor's office.

Enclosed are the following documents:

- Financial Reports we run on a fiscal calendar of July 1 to June 30. I have enclosed three reports. Of note in May of 2020 we received a PPP loan of \$123, 907.00 and in March of 2021 of \$91,500.00.

AMENDMENTS TO THE ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF THE REDEMPTORIST SOCIETY OF ARIZONA

ARTICLE VII is amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE VII

The duration of the corporation shall be perpetual.

BYLAWS OF REDEMPTORIST SOCIETY OF ARIZONA AN ARIZONA NONPROFIT CORPORATION

ARTICLE I PURPOSES AND RESTRICTIONS

The purposes of the Corporation shall be those non-profit purposes stated in the Articles of Incorporation, as may be amended. No part of the net earnings or other assets of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, be distributed to or among, or revert to any Member, Director, officer, contributor or other private individual having, directly or indirectly, any personal or private interest in the activities of the Corporation, except that the Corporation may pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and may make payments and distributions in furtherance of the non-profit purposes stated in the Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE II OFFICES

The principal office of the Corporation in the State of Arizona shall be located in Tucson, Arizona. The Corporation may have such other offices as may be required.

ARTICLE III MEMBERS

- Section 1. <u>Classes of Members</u>. The Corporation shall have two classes of members. The designation of each class and the qualifications of the members of each class shall be as follows:
 - (a) <u>Class A Members</u>. Class A membership in the Corporation shall consist of those individuals who are members of the Extraordinary Provincial Council of the religious institute known as the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer (the "Redemptorists"), Denver Province. A Class A Member shall not be liable for the debts or obligations of the Corporation.
 - (b) <u>Class B Members</u>. Class B membership in the Corporation shall consist of those individuals who are members of the Ordinary Provincial Council of the religious institute known as the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer (the "Redemptorists"), Denver Province. A Class B Member shall not be liable for the debts or obligations of the Corporation.

Section 2. Reserved Powers.

- (a) The following powers are reserved to the Class A Members of the Corporation:
- (i) To appoint the President of the Corporation.

- (ii) To approve any amendment to the Articles of Incorporation and the Bylaws of the Corporation.
- (iii) To approve the establishment of the philosophy of the Corporation according to which the Corporation shall operate.
- (iv) To approve any merger, consolidation, dissolution or other change in the corporate structure of the Corporation.
- (b) The following powers are reserved to the Class B Members of the Corporation:
 - (i) To approve the election of the Directors to the Board of Directors of the Corporation.
 - (ii) To approve any lease, sale, or encumbrance of any real estate of the Corporation.
- Section 3. <u>Voting Rights</u>. Each Member of each class of Members shall be entitled to one vote on each matter submitted to a vote of the Members of that class.
- Section 4. Meetings. The Annual Meeting of the Members of each class shall be held at such time and place within or without the State of Arizona as shall be designated by the Members of each class. Additional regular meetings and special meetings of the Members of each class may be called by or at the request of the President, the Board of Directors, or any Member of each class. Members of each class may participate in a meeting of the Members of that class by means of conference telephone or similar communications equipment, whereby all persons participating in the meeting can hear each other, and participation in a meeting in this manner shall constitute presence in person at the meeting.
- Section 5. Action By Members of Each Class Without A Meeting. Any action which is required to be or may be taken at a meeting of the Members of any class, may be taken without a meeting if consents in writing, setting forth the action so taken, are signed by all of the Members of that class. The consent shall have the same force and effect as a unanimous vote at a meeting duly held, and may be stated as such in any certificate or document.
- Section 6. Notice of Meeting of Members. Notice of any annual, regular or special meeting shall be given at least five days prior thereto by written notice delivered personally or mailed to each Member at such Member's business or home address. If mailed, such notices shall be deemed to be delivered when deposited in the United States mail in a sealed envelope so addressed, with postage thereon prepaid. Any Member may waive notice of any meeting. The attendance of a Member at any meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting, except where a Member attends a meeting for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened. Neither the business to be transacted at, nor the purpose of, any annual, regular or special meeting of the Members need be specified in the notice or waiver of notice of such meeting, unless otherwise provided in these Bylaws.
 - Section 7. Quorum. Two-thirds of the Members of a class shall constitute a quorum

for the transaction of business at any meeting of the Members of that class.

Section 8. <u>Manner of Acting</u>. The act of the majority of the Members of a class present at a meeting of the Members of that class at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Members of that class.

ARTICLE IV BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- Section 1. <u>Management</u>. The affairs of the Corporation shall be managed, supervised and controlled by a Board of Directors, which shall consist of a minimum of three (3) persons, and a total number as decided, from time to time, by the Board of Directors.
 - Section 2. <u>Qualifications, Term and Election of Directors</u>.
 - (a) <u>Election</u>. The President of the Corporation shall be an *ex-officio* member of the Board of Directors. The remaining Directors shall be elected by a majority of the Board for a term of one (1) year, at the annual meeting of the Board of Directors.
 - (b) Nomination and Approval By The Class B Members of the Corporation. Prior to the annual meeting of the Board of Directors, the Nominating Committee shall submit to the Class B Members of the Corporation the names and background information of candidates they would propose for election to the Board of Directors. Prior to the Board voting for any candidate, that candidate must have been approved by the Class B Members of the Corporation, and written notice of that approval must have been received by the Board. Candidates may be from the Redemptorists or from lay persons.
 - (c) <u>Vacancies</u>. Any vacancy occurring in the Board of Directors or any Directorship to be filled by reason of an increase in the number of Directors, shall be filled by the Board of Directors in the manner and as provided in Section 2.(a) and (b) above. Any Director may succeed himself or herself indefinitely.
 - (d) <u>Chairman</u>, <u>Vice-Chairman</u>. The President of the Corporation shall be the Chairman of the Board of Directors. The Board may elect a Director to serve as Vice-Chairman.
 - (e) <u>Resignation</u>. A Director may resign at any time upon written notice to the Board of Directors.
- Section 3. Meetings. The Annual Meeting of the Board of Directors and all meetings of the Board, regular or special, shall be held at the principal office of the Corporation, or at such place within or without the State of Arizona, and at such time, as shall be designated by the Chairman, or if not designated by the Chairman, then as determined by the Board of Directors. The annual meeting shall be held for the purpose of electing officers and Directors and transacting such other business as may come before the meeting. Additional regular meetings and special meetings of the Board of Directors may be called by or at the request of the Chairman, or in the Chairman's absence by the Vice-Chairman, or by any two Directors. Members of the Board of Directors, or of any committee designated by the Board of Directors, may participate in a meeting of the Board or committee by means of conference telephone or similar communications equipment

whereby all persons participating in the meeting can hear each other, and participation in a meeting in this manner shall constitute presence in person at the meeting.

- Section 4. Action by Directors Without a Meeting. Any action which is required to be or may be taken at a meeting of the Directors, or of any committee of the Directors, may be taken without a meeting if consents in writing, setting forth the action so taken, are signed by all of the members of the Board or of the committee as the case may be. The consent shall have the same force and effect as a unanimous vote at a meeting duly held, and may be stated as such in any certificate or document. The Secretary shall file the consents with the minutes of the meetings of the Board of Directors or of the committee as the case may be.
- Section 5. Notice. Notice of any annual, regular or special meeting shall be given at least five days prior thereto by written notice delivered personally or mailed to each Director at such Director's business or home address. If mailed, such notices shall be deemed to be delivered when deposited in the United States mail in a sealed envelope so addressed, with postage thereon prepaid. Any Director may waive notice of any meeting. The attendance of a Director at any meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting, except where a Director attends a meeting for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened. Neither the business to be transacted at, nor the purpose of, any regular of special meeting of the Board of Directors need be specified in the notice or waiver of notice of such meeting, unless otherwise provided in these Bylaws.
- Section 6. Quorum. Two-thirds of the members of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the Board of Directors.
- Section 7. <u>Manner of Acting</u>. The act of the majority of the Directors present at a meeting of the Directors at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Board of Directors, unless a greater number is required under these Bylaws.

ARTICLE V COMMITTEES, COMMISSIONS AND ADVISORY BOARDS

- Section 1. Executive Committee. There shall be elected annually by the Board of Directors two (2) or more members of the Board who, with the Chairman, shall constitute an Executive Committee. They may exercise the powers of the Board of Directors when the Board of Directors is not in session, reporting any action taken to the Board of Directors at its succeeding meeting. A majority of the members of the Executive Committee shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. Meetings may be called by the Chairman or by two (2) members.
- Section 2. <u>Nominating Committee</u>. There shall be elected annually by the Board of Directors two (2) or more members of the Board who, with the Chairman, shall constitute a Nominating Committee, for the purpose of submitting candidates for the Board of Directors to the Class B Members of the Corporation for their approval, as provided in Article IV, Section 2(b) of these Bylaws.
- Section 3. Other Committees. The Board of Directors, by resolution adopted by a majority of the Directors in office, may designate one or more committees each of which will consist of two or more Directors and such other persons as the Board of Directors designates,

provided that a majority of each committee's membership are Directors. The committees, to the extent provided in said resolution, shall have and exercise the authority of the Board of Directors in the management of the Corporation; but the designation of such committees and the delegation thereto of authority shall not operate to relieve the Board of Directors, or any individual Director, of any responsibility imposed upon it, him or her by law.

- Section 4. <u>Commissions or Advisory Bodies</u>. Commissions or advisory bodies not having and exercising the authority of the Board of Directors in the Corporation may be designated or created by the Board of Directors and shall consist of such person or persons as the Board of Directors designates. A commission or advisory body may or may not have Directors as members, as the Board of Directors determines. The commission or advisory body may not act on behalf of the Corporation or bind it to any actions but may make recommendations to the Board of Directors or to the officers of the Corporation.
- Section 5. <u>Term of Office</u>. Each member of a committee, advisory board or commission shall continue as such until the next annual meeting of the Board of Directors and until his or her successor is appointed, unless the committee, advisory board or commission shall be sooner terminated, or unless such member be removed from such committee, advisory board or commission by the Board of Directors.
- Section 6. <u>Chairman</u>. One member of each committee, advisory board or commission shall be appointed Chairman of that particular committee, advisory board, or commission.
- Section 7. <u>Vacancies</u>, Vacancies in the membership of any committee, advisory board or commission may be filled by appointments made in the same manner as provided in the case of the original appointments.
- Section 8. Quorum. Unless otherwise provided in the resolution of the Board of Directors designating a committee, advisory board or commission, a majority of the whole committee, advisory board or commission shall constitute a quorum and the act of a majority of the members present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the committee, advisory board or commission.
- Section 9. Rules. Each committee, advisory board or commission may adopt rules for its own government not inconsistent with these Bylaws or with rules adopted by the Board of Directors.
- Section 10. <u>Informal Action</u>. The authority of a committee may be exercised without a meeting if a consent in writing, setting forth the action taken, is signed by all the members entitled to vote.

ARTICLE VI OFFICERS

Section 1. Officers. The officers of the Corporation shall be a President, a Treasurer, a Secretary, and such other officers as may be elected by the Board of Directors. Officers whose authority and duties are not prescribed in these Bylaws shall have the authority and perform the duties prescribed, from time to time, by the Board of Directors. Any two or more offices may be

held by the same person, except that the Secretary may not serve concurrently as the President.

- Section 2. <u>Term and Election of Officers</u>. The officers of the Corporation shall be elected annually by the Board of Directors at the regular annual meeting of the Board of Directors, except for the President, who shall be appointed by the Class A Members of the Corporation.
- Section 3. Removal and Resignation. Any officer, except the President, may be removed by the Board of Directors at any meeting of the Board, whenever in its judgment the best interests of the Corporation would be served thereby. Any officer may resign at any time by giving written notice to the Secretary. Any such resignation shall take effect at the time specified therein; and unless otherwise specified therein, the acceptance of a resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective.
- Section 4. President. The President shall be the chief executive officer of the Corporation and shall be a member of the religious institute known as the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer (the "Redemptorists"). The President shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors, shall have the power to transact all of the usual, necessary and regular business of the Corporation as may be required and, with such prior authorization of the Board as may be required by these Bylaws, to execute such contracts and other documents or instruments as shall be required by the Corporation, and, in general, the President shall perform all such other duties incident to the office of President and chief executive officer and such other duties as may from time to time be prescribed by the Board of Directors.
- Section 5. <u>Secretary</u>. The Secretary shall record and preserve the minutes of the meetings of the Board of Directors, shall be the custodian of the corporate records, shall cause notices of all meetings of the Board of Directors to be given, and shall perform all other duties incident to the office of Secretary or as from time to time directed by the Board of Directors or by the President.
- Section 6. Treasurer. The Treasurer shall be the principal accounting and financial officer of the corporation. He shall (a) have charge of and be responsible for the maintenance of adequate books of account for the Corporation; (b) have charge and custody of all funds and securities of the Corporation, and be responsible therefore, and for the receipt and disbursement thereof; and (c) perform all the duties incident to the office of Treasurer and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the President or by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VII GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section 1. Execution of Documents. Except as in these Bylaws otherwise provided or restricted, the Board of Directors may authorize any officer or officers, agent or agents to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the Corporation, and such authority may be general or confined to specific instances; and, unless so authorized, no officer, agent or employee shall have any power or authority to bind the Corporation by any contract or engagement or to pledge its credit or to render it liable pecuniarily for any purpose or in any amount unless in the ordinary course of business.

- Section 2. <u>Deposits</u>, All funds of the Corporation shall be deposited from time to time to the credit of the Corporation with such banks, bankers, trust companies or other depositories as the Board of Directors may select or as may be selected by any officer or officers, agent or agents of the Corporation to whom such power may be delegated from time to time by the Board of Directors.
- Section 3. <u>Checks, Drafts, And Other Instruments</u>. All checks, drafts or other orders for the payment of money, notes, acceptances or other evidence of indebtedness issued in the name of the Corporation, shall be signed by the President, or in the President's absence by the Vice President, or the Treasurer or such officer or officers, agent or agents of the Corporation, and in such manner as shall be determined from time to time by resolution of the Board of Directors in accordance with the provisions of these Bylaws.
- Section 4. <u>Gifts</u>. The Board of Directors may accept on behalf of the Corporation any contribution, gift, bequest or devise for the general purposes or for any special purpose of the Corporation.

ARTICLE VIII FISCAL YEAR

The fiscal year of the Corporation shall be fixed by resolution of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE IX AMENDMENTS

The Board of Directors, or any Class A Member of the Corporation, shall submit to the Class A Members of the Corporation for approval any proposed change or changes in the Bylaws. The power to alter, amend, or repeal the Bylaws or adopt new Bylaws shall be vested in the Class A Members of the Corporation, and shall require a majority vote of the Class A Members. Such action may be taken at a regular or special meeting for which written notice of the purpose shall be given.

ARTICLE X INDEMNIFICATION

Section 1. <u>Indemnification</u>.

(a) The Corporation may indemnify any person who was or is a party, or is threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending or completed action, suit or proceedings, whether civil, criminal, administrative or investigative (other than an action by or in the right of the Corporation) by reason of the fact that he or she is or was a Member, Director, officer, employee or agent of the Corporation, against expenses (including attorneys' fees), judgments, fines and amounts paid in settlement actually and reasonably incurred by such person in connection with such action, suit or proceeding, if such person acted in good faith and in a manner he or she reasonably believed to be in, or not opposed to, the best interests of the Corporation, and, with respect to any criminal

action or proceeding, had no reasonable cause to believe his or her conduct was unlawful.

- (b) Expenses incurred in defending a civil or criminal action, suit or proceeding may be paid by the Corporation in advance of the final disposition of such action, suit or proceeding, as authorized by the Board of Directors in the specific case, upon receipt of an undertaking by or on behalf of the Member, Director, officer, employee or agent to repay such amount, unless it shall ultimately be determined that he or she is entitled to be indemnified by the Corporation as authorized in this Article.
- Section 2. <u>Determination Of Conduct</u>. Any indemnification under Section 1 of this Article shall be made by the Corporation only as authorized in the specific case, upon a determination that indemnification of the Member, Director, officer, employee or agent is proper in the circumstances because he or she has met the applicable standard of conduct set forth in Section 1. of this Article. Such determination shall be made (a) by the Board of Directors by a majority vote of a quorum consisting of Directors who were not parties to such action, suit or proceeding, or (b) if such a quorum is not obtainable, or even if obtainable, if a quorum of disinterested Directors so directs, by independent legal counsel in a written opinion.
- Section 3. <u>Indemnification Not Exclusive</u>. The indemnification provided by this Article shall not be deemed exclusive of any other rights to which those seeking indemnification may be entitled under any Bylaw, agreement, vote of disinterested Directors, or otherwise, both as to action in his or her official capacity and as to action in another capacity while holding such office, and shall continue as to a person who has ceased to be a Member, Director, officer, employee or agent, and shall inure to the benefit of the heirs, executors and administrators of such a person.
- Section 4. <u>Insurance</u>. The Corporation may purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any person who is or was a Member, Director, officer, employee or agent of the Corporation, against any liability asserted against such person and incurred by such person in any such capacity, or arising out of his or her status as such, whether or not the Corporation would have the power to indemnify such person against such liability under the provisions of this Article.

ARTICLE XI MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

- Section 1. <u>Charitable Purpose</u>. Notwithstanding any other provisions of the Articles of Incorporation or the Bylaws, it shall be the policy of the Corporation to operate exclusively for charitable, educational, and religious purposes, which will qualify it as an exempt organization within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws, including, for those purposes, the making of distributions to organizations which qualify as tax-exempt organizations under that Code.
- Section 2. <u>Inurement of Income</u>. The property of the Corporation is irrevocably dedicated for charitable, educational, and religious purposes, and no part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its members, directors, officers or other private persons except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered, and make payments and

distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth above to organizations exempt from taxation under Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or any corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

Section 3. <u>Legislative or Political Activities</u>. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation and the Corporation shall not participate in or intervene (including the publishing or distribution of statements) in any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

Section 4. Operational Limitations. Notwithstanding any other provisions of the Articles of Incorporation or these Bylaws, the Corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revnue Code of 1986, or the corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws, or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws).

Section 5. <u>Dissolution</u>. Upon the dissolution or winding up of this Corporation, its assets remaining after the payment of, or provision for the payment of, all debts and liabilities of this Corporation, shall be distributed to The Redemptorists/Denver Province if it is then in existence and organized and operated exclusively for charitable and/or religious purposes and exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws, but if not then in existence or so organized and operated or exempt, to another organization which is organized and operated exclusively for charitable and/or religious purposes and which has established its tax-exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

Section 6. <u>Nondiscrimination Policy</u>. Facilities or programs owned or operated by the Corporation shall not discriminate in employment or admission against any person on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, or disability.

Letter of Intent

History and Details of Activities Conducted on the Property

The **Redemptorist Renewal Center** is run by the Redemptorists of the Denver Province. The Religious Congregation was founded by St. Alphonsus Liguori in 1732 in Naples, Italy. They were dedicated to the poor and abandoned who lived in rural areas. Once they established their early communities, they built houses where they could conduct retreats for the people of the area. This practice continues throughout the world and here in Tucson at Picture Rocks.

All religious orders have some particular call by the Catholic Church to serve the people of God with a unique charism and spirituality. The initial plan to found a Retreat House in Arizona came from the Redemptorists of the Oakland Province. They wanted to expand their ministry and sought a place in the desert near Tucson to conduct Retreats. In January, 1962, they tasked Fr. Bernard Van Hoomissen with finding the ideal location. In his search, he located a potential sight where the Petroglyphs are found and realized the sacredness and spiritual significance of this location.

While the details for the necessary buildings were being worked out the Redemptorists were building relationships with parishes in the Tucson Diocese since they would be the one who would benefit from having a retreat house near the city. Bishop Francis Green was very supportive of the project. The new Arizona Redemptorist community was established on the feast of St. Gerard on October 16, 1964. Construction began immediately on the Chapel by stone mason John Moran. He also carved the crosses on entrance stones to the property. The original construction included the St. Gerard Chapel (known now as Our Lady of the Desert Conventual Church), office, Redemptorist residence, kitchen/dining hall/meeting room, convent and 4 building with 48 sleeping rooms for retreatants.

The documents from the Vatican Council had a major impact not only on the church but also on retreat ministry and Religious Life. Ecumenical dialog was valued and programs were initiated to see that retreat ministry was not only for Catholics but to help all people get closer to God. Redemptorists saw that a retreat house was one way of reaching people.

The Redemptorist Renewal Center has changed over the years from the early retreats that were conducted for male and female groups of the diocese. Parish Retreats were the focus of the ministry. Today groups from all over the United States, as well as international organizations come to the desert for their own spiritual enrichment. The Redemptorist run a number of programs that draw people from across the world. They include the Hesychia School of Spiritual Direction, directed retreats, intensive contemplative retreats, Serenity Retreats, Sisters' Eight-Day preached retreats and a 10-week sabbatical program. The Redemptorist also support the pastoral needs of Santa Catalina Parish.

Over the past 56 years the Redemptorists have completed many building projects to enhance their facilities in order to do their ministry. The current buildings on the property include:

- Office
- Sabbatical area 6 sleeping rooms, common room & oratory
- Our Lady of the Desert Church
- Dining room/kitchen
- Religious bookstore
- 4 buildings all containing sleeping rooms
- 3 hermitages containing 6 sleeping rooms
- 2 buildings containing 4 meeting rooms
- 1 building containing 5 sleeping rooms, library, contemplative chapel
- Library
- Priests rectory (residence for 8 Catholic priests)

Several projects have been undertaken in order to make their property more accessible. The property contains many places of devotion:

- Way of the Cross Outdoor stations began in 1966 and were updated in 2008
- Our Mother of Perpetual Help & Rosary The sacred image was first installed in 1967 but deteriorated due to the weather and was replaced in 2018. The original image of Our Mother of Perpetual Help is located in Rome.
- Campanile (Bell Tower) Dedicated to our Blessed Mother The Statue of the Immaculate Conception arrived in 1966. The original shrine was completed that same year and was replaced in 2011. The bell came from the Redemptorist Seminary in Oakland.
- Petroglyphs These extraordinary petroglyphs date back to the Hohokam Indians between 800 and 1300 AD. At least 146 petroglyph panels are present on the sides and top of Picture Rocks Hill, while 70 or more are located on the hills' west face. This was a religious site that includes drawings which depict hunting, ritual gatherings and other communal practices that reflected their daily lives.
- Outdoor Chapel This location was originally meant for retreatants to mediate and pray (especially in the morning when the sun rises over the Catalina Mountains). In 2004 an altar, ambo and benches were added so outdoor Masses or gathering of groups had an outdoor location.
- The Labyrinth this particular design comes from the Chartres Cathedral in France. Labyrinths are used as a form of meditation to help people reflect on their own journey with God.

The **Desert House of Prayer** had its beginning when Redemptorist Retreat leader, Fr John Kane realized the need for extended silence and solitude during retreats. Fr Kane wanted a more scholarly approach to prayer. He also needed a core community that was as committed as he was to create this contemplative way of life. Word traveled quickly about this prayer community. In 1978 land across Picture Rocks Road became available and the Desert House of Prayer moved off the property of the Redemptorist Renewal Center (7101). Seminars were created in

feminist theology, literature, film, music, art and religious studies with the intention of bringing awareness to what is both human truly Christian.

This property consists of:

- Our Lady of Solitude Chapel
- 6 Hermitage sleeping rooms
- The Thomas Merton Library/meeting room
- 2 buildings with sleeping rooms
- Dining room/kitchen/common room
- 15 Stations of the Cross were built in the desert surrounding the buildings

Over the course of 57 years the original mission of the property has not changed. While it has evolved it still focuses on the Redemptorist charism of preaching and teaching, as well as Spiritual Direction. The Redemptorist Renewal Center and the Desert House of Prayer are a listening ear to religious and laity as they discern God presence and action in their lives.

*AMERICA'*S GUIDE TO RETREATS

Many of our readers are curious about retreats. What does one do on a retreat? Where does one go? What are some good retreat houses? Simply put, a retreat is an extended period of prayer, usually done in silence, and usually at a retreat house, where a team of spiritual directors helps you find God in your prayer. There are also different kinds of retreats. On a directed retreat a person meets daily with a spiritual director to discuss what is happening in prayer. A guided retreat focuses more on one topic (say, women's spirituality) and offers presentations as well as opportunities to meet with a director a few times. Preached retreats consist in listening to presentations and praying on your own, but with less opportunity for direction. And our retreat houses are also good places to connect with trained professional who will help you with regular spiritual direction.

Thought for the Day Monday, June 21st

God asks Abram to do something very hard in today's first reading. He is asked to leave everything he knows and loves behind, and journey to a land to which God will lead him. Abram goes without questioning. This dedication and trust in God is what exemplifies this man of faith. God asks us to trust him as well. We are not called to leave family and friends necessarily, but we are called to forget our own will, to forget our own selfish desires, and to do what God wills. This can be very scary. After all, we might very well feel that if we don't look out for ourselves, who will? The challenge is always to be like Abram and trust that the God who calls us will support us.

Tuesday, June 22nd

Today's Gospel contains a challenge. Jesus talks about the wide gate and the narrow gate. Many people enter through the wide gate that leads to material wealth and satisfaction. Jesus urges us to enter rather the narrow gate by living for Him, not for ourselves. We might pray today on this: To what degree am I committed to working for material wealth that will not last, than for a spiritual one that will?

Wednesday, June 23rd

In today's first reading, God enters into a covenant with Abram. A covenant is essentially an agreement through which two parties will consider each other family. To enter a covenant, animals and birds were slaughtered and cut in half. Both parties would walk between the animal halves. They were basically saying, If I fail to keep this agreement, may this same thing (death) happen to me." God is committed to us. When we sinned, we broke our commitment to Him. Yet, rather than us having to die, God sent his Son to become human like us and to die in our place. Such is God's love for us!

Thursday, June 24th

Today we celebrate the Nativity of John the Baptist. This is a most unusual feast. In the whole Church year, we celebrate only 3 births: those of Jesus, Mary, and John the Baptist. That is a really amazing group that John is thrown into! Yet, he played a pivotal role in salvation. He is the one who prepared the people for Jesus and pointed them in his direction. Perhaps today we can say a prayer to John the Baptist asking him to pray for us, that we will more fully follow the Lord.


Friday, June 25th

In today's gospel, Jesus breaks one of the purity laws. He touches a leper. The Pharisees taught that by touching an unclean person like a leper, you yourself became unclean. However, Jesus seems to have seen things differently. He knew that when he touched a leper or sinner who was unclean, they became cleansed by his touch. The power of love, of compassion was always stronger than the power of evil in Jesus' mind. Where might you need that purifying touch of Jesus in your life?

Saturday, June 26th

Before receiving communion at mass, we pray a special prayer: Lord, I am not worthy to have you enter under my roof, but, only say the word and my soul will be healed. This prayer comes out of today's Gospel story. It is a prayer of humility. It expresses an unworthiness to receive God's love, but a confidence that we will receive a healing in us because of that Love. Every time we pray this prayer, we remind ourselves that God loves us so much that he lowers himself to come to us with the healing that we need. A good thought to ponder the next time you receive communion is "Where do I especially need the Lord's healing in my life?"


Novena Prayer to Our Mother of Perpetual Help adapted to be prayed in Response to the COVID-19 Pandemic

Dear Padre,

Our parish used to be united. Now we have Filipino Catholics, Vietnamese Catholics, and Mexican Catholics, all with their own Masses and activities. Why can't we just be Catholic?

T he word *catholic* means "whole," "universal," "complete." To be Catholic, we must include everyone. I once served as a pastor of the only Catholic parish in a town of 20,000 people, more than half of whom were Catholic. The seventeen Baptist churches included a First Southern with services only in English, a First Baptist with services only in English, a First Baptist with services only in Spanish, and a Southern Baptist with services

only in Spanish.



The Catholic Church goes out of its way to make sure that never happens to us and that all people feel part of the Church. One way to make a person feel welcome is to offer Mass in his or her native language, which is why my parish offered Masses in Spanish and Vietnamese as well as in English.

It wasn't just about language or nationality. We had Sunday-evening Mass to accommodate the many

people who worked Sunday mornings. And we also had events that brought the entire parish together. The result was that we had six weekend Masses rather than six different communities.

It's difficult to form one Church. It's difficult to be Catholic. But for 2,000 years we've found it to be worth it. Culturally diverse faith communities acknowledge our differences; more importantly, we celebrate our Catholic wholeness through this diversity!



THE REDEMPTORIST RENEWAL CENTER

Situated in the foothills of the Tucson Mountains and the beautiful Sonoran Desert, the Redemptorist Renewal Center at Picture Rocks is a spiritual life and renewal center that provides a unique opportunity for solitude, reflection, prayer and contemplative practice.

Located on 120 acres that border the Saguaro National Park West, it is a site that appeals to the nature lover and gently challenges the more urban personality.

With miles of trails available into the desert, the variety of the desert flora (especially the cacti) and fauna, plus ancient **Hohokam Indian rock art (petroglyphs)**. Most of the petroglyphs at this site is believed to have been created by the Hohokam Indian culture between A.D. 800 and 1100. They are located on the Renewal Center property (Petroglyph information @ RRC). This is an atmosphere that inevitably nudges visitors to draw closer to the sacred.





For visitors who take precious time away from their demanding life circumstances, the Renewal Center becomes what it once was for the Hohokam, who etched their appreciation of life and its meaning on the jagged rocks hundreds of years ago: holy ground.

On the wall of the **Our Lady of the Desert Church** at the Center is a saying that paraphrases Hosea 2:14: "The desert will lead you to your heart where I will speak." For those who come to know this special place in the desert, the paraphrase on the chapel wall accurately depicts their experience here. It is a place that helps people get in touch with their inner-self and discover and hear again the Lord speaking to them from within...the most sacred place of all.

The Redemptorist Renewal Center is a place where God may be discovered in action. It is not just a physically beautiful place, but it is a place where a person may listen to the voice of God. It is a place where the Redemptorist community is privileged to serve their brothers and sisters in the Lord. In the inevitable exchange, in each experience of sharing, listening and silence, the healing and nourishing power of the Spirit of God is at work.

MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of the ministerial community at the Redemptorist Renewal Center at Picture Rocks is to establish a permanent apostolic presence in southern Arizona that reflects the commitment of the Denver Province of Redemptorists to retreat ministry and contemplative renewal.

This presence and commitment to contemplative renewal is expressed in the lifestyle and work of the community, both Redemptorists and our associates in ministry. This realization of the inseparable unity of divine and human, which animates the contemplative life, is also expressed through the programs created, hosted, and sponsored by the community, each of which reflect, in the way proper to their purpose, something of the living font of the spirit of Saint Alphonsus Liguori, which is the charism of "Plentiful Redemption for all."

VISION STATEMENT

Saint Alphonsus Liguori, founder of the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer (Redemptorists), was a spiritual pioneer of 18th-century Italy. Educated as a lawyer, Alphonsus left his practice to become a priest and to work with the poor. Concerned with the spiritually and economically abandoned, he brought the Christian traditions of prayer and moral theology into the busy streets of his native Naples and into the neglected villages of the countryside, arousing the sentiments of the common people to seek God. Of his many gifts, Alphonsus' understanding that the heart of contemplation is worked out in a person's daily struggle to forge a life of unceasing prayer, moral behavior and love of neighbor, remains his most enduring legacy.

In this spirit, the Redemptorist Renewal Center envisions a community in the desert in which Alphonsus' vision of contemplation as the animating force of the daily life of faith is renewed for our times. To foster this vision, we have placed Alphonsus' combination of spiritual acumen and practical good sense at the center of our ministry.



HISTORY OF THE REDEMPTORIST RENEWAL CENTER


A Place of Divine Encounter

Time and time again through the short history of the Redemptorist Renewal Center, when Church officials described this retreat house on Picture Rocks Road, they would label it as a "sacred place" for God and the people who seek his presence to have an encounter. Located adjacent to the Saguaro National Park, the Center has provided spiritual comfort and development for the faithful in the Tucson diocese and beyond. It also welcomes our Christian brothers and sisters of various denominations, as well as other religious followers, since it opened more than 50 years ago.

At the dedication of the newly renovated facilities on Dec. 9-10, 2006, Bishop Gerald F. Kicanas of Tucson presided the dedication Mass. Bishop Kicanas also noted how the Center has served the local diocese, and how he sees the function of the Center. He wrote: "The new renovated facility nestled in the midst of our

beautiful desert greatly enhances the services able to be provided. As these facilities are dedicated, we express our thanks to God for this holy place in which many will encounter Christ and grow in their faith..."

Anniversary of RRC Celebration Cardinal Joseph W. Tobin, C.Ss.R, of Newark, former superior General of the Redemptorists worldwide, said: "I see the mission of the Redemptorist Renewal Center as a partnership with God in a process of divine seduction.

The Eternal Lover of humankind still wishes to lure people into the desert where God may speak to our hearts (cf. Hosea 2, 16). The new facilities at the Redemptorist Renewal Center are simply the venue where lovers can meet and speak."

In 1995, the Redemptorists organized a program for its members, entitled ReVision. They chose the Center for the one-month long program. When asked why he chose the site at Picture Rocks, Father Robert Fenili, C.Ss.R., Director of the program, said: "This is a very sacred spot which we have brought back to its special purpose by building a retreat house here in 1963. Fifteen hundred years ago, this land was a holy place of the Hohokam people. They carved their sacred images on the boulders of these hills. I suspect God provided this oasis in the Sonoran desert to bring a special sense of the divine presence to those who come here to rest."

Many people would have agreed with Father Fenili. Laypeople, Religious, priests and bishops have expressed the same sentiment after they have spent some time here for their retreats or renewal programs.

Humble Origin

Situated about a 20 minute drive northwest from downtown Tucson, the Center has been built on a site of more than 100 acres. In its mountain and desert setting, it provides a conducive atmosphere for prayer and reflection. The property was purchased in 1963 by the Redemptorist Fathers of the Oakland Province. The late Father Bernard Van Hoomissen is the pioneer settler and builder.

In an article in the South Tucson Gazette, July 5, 1963, the Redemptorists made an announcement to construct a retreat house. Up to this time, the only retreat house in the diocese has been the Franciscan Retreat House in Scottsdale, the article says. The Tucson diocese at that time also included the City of Phoenix, which eventually was set up as a diocese in 1969. It adds that Bishop Francis J. Green of Tucson had invited the Redemptorists to open the retreat house here. The chosen site for the retreat house is in the Tucson Mountains, approximately 13 miles from downtown Tucson. It includes the famous Indian carvings, known as "Indian Picture Rocks," believed to be the work of Hohokam Indians about 1100 A.D., and precautions will be taken to preserve the carvings from the vandalism prevalent in recent years, the article says.

Early Construction

In his diary, Father Hoomissen wrote:

"On March 22, 1962 visited Picture Rocks and decided to go after it though it was not for sale. The first step was to bury several medals of St. Gerard on the site. Father Andrew Gorger, a native Arizonan, approved highly of the site. The first price was \$950 per acre. ... the final price of \$600.00 per acre was agreed on."

After 21 months of his effort of looking for land, purchasing it, getting a loan, surveying the land, getting local government permission for the land, he ended his summary diary with the following passage: "Please God and good St. Gerard that this effort will open a new and fertile apostolic field for the Coast Province. Now is the time to take up the plow."

Early Retreats

Father Hoomissen later in 1964 was joined by Father Raymond Troik, and the two lived in a trailer when buildings were constructed. The Redemptorists of the Oakland Province knew that to begin this ministry, it had to obtain a legal status. Thus the Redemptorist Society of Arizona was established on August 8, 1963 in order to purchase the property from Ben Lim. John Moran, a prospector and a mason, took on the task of constructing the chapel. A plaque bearing his name at the northeast entrance commemorates his accomplishment. St. Alphonsus building was also build and set up as a convent. The major part of the construction was completed in less than a year. The buildings that which were a part of the first Retreat House was St. Gerard building, office (at that time was Redemptorist residence), kitchen,

dining hall, meeting room, convent and 4 buildings with 48 rooms for retreatants. The retreatants' quarters consisted of four buildings of 12 rooms each, with connecting baths between each pair of room. Two such units were to the north of the chapel, two to the south.

The Sisters' convent was the first to be completed; its chapel, with a picture window looking toward the mountains, provides a beautiful view of the rugged mountain terrain. The central chapel had been constructed from rock quarried on the property. A combination cafeteria and lounge were to the south of the chapel, while to the north of it was the administration building, which was also the residence of the Redemptorists who staff the retreat. Scenic view of the early Retreat Center In one of his letters to his superior, Father Hoomissen wrote on Nov. 11, 1964, about the difficult work he faced:

"Today is the first breather in many a days, and there is time for a short progress report. It has been progress for a change and the hillside is busy. About 200 tons of rock have been quarried (value \$9,000.00) and cut. We have moved over a 100 ton to wall side. The reinforced foundations of both the sisters' house and chapel are finished. Tomorrow, the walls start up – cement, sand, clocks, etc. are in place."

Dedication of Renovated and Reconstructed Facilities on Dec. 10, 2006

In 2003, Father Thomas M. Santa, C.Ss.R, director of the Redemptorist Renewal Center, began a capital campaign for a major renovation and development of the Center. He said during the last 40 years there had been occasional improvements to the facility only that which was "absolutely necessary and unavoidable." At the time, he said: "We have arrived at the point where major renovation and repair is perhaps long overdue." In their plan, the Redemptorists planned to build a large meeting room, the Alphonsian Library, the Contemplative Intensive Retreat facility, Hermitages, Redemptorist Rectory and necessary repairs and remodeling.

The project went off to a good start until Oct. 7, 2005 when a fire burned down the main dining hall and kitchen facilities. A new plan had to be drawn to include the reconstruction of the new kitchen, dining room and another meeting room.

Aftermath of the Fire

The renovation was finally completed a year later after the fire in October 2007. On Dec. 9-10, 2006, Bishop Kicanas presided at the dedication and blessing of the Center. Hundreds of benefactors, friends and supporters of RRC joined him and the Redemptorists on this happy occasion.


New Dining, Kitchen and Petroglyph Room

The Center with its newly renovated facilities once again is open to people of the Diocese of Tucson as well as the needs of the wider ecumenical community. Many people from different religious traditions and spiritual practices identify the Center as generations before as "sacred space." According to Father Santa, people identify the Center as a place of welcome, of gracious hospitality, and a place conducive to prayer, spiritual direction, and the community support and encouragement that enables the presence of the Spirit of God.

The 50th Anniversary of the Redemptorist Renewal Center


