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Regarding Agenda Item 13, ORDINANCE NO. 2026 - 2,

My name is Caroline Isaacs and I am a resident of Pima County District 4. My comments are directed at my representative, Steve Christy. In the past, in relation to the masking ordinance, I have heard Supervisor Christy speak at length about his concerns for the safety and welfare of federal ICE agents. He went to great pains a few months ago to use the issue to publicly court an endorsement from law enforcement unions. I am curious to know how many federal ICE or DHS enforcement agents currently live, work, and vote in his district that he would feel compelled to place their health and safety above that of others whom he was elected to represent. As someone who does live, work, and vote here in District 4, I cannot say I have met very many. I do, however, know many neighbors who are members of immigrant or mixed-status families, refugees, and people of color. The kinds of people who are being harassed, rounded up, and detained by mask-wearing enforcement agents. Law enforcement and federal agents are extremely well protected. The rest of Supervisor Christy's constituents--the people he was elected to serve--are not. They are afraid to leave their homes. They are afraid to exercise their First Amendment rights. I encourage Supervisor Christy to take into account the safety and wellbeing of ALL the people he represents when he decides his vote on this ordinance. Thank you.
