Re: **2025 Annual Report**

For your review is the [2025 Annual Report for the Pima County Transition Center](#), operated by the Department of Justice Services (DJS).

The report provides a comprehensive overview of program utilization, outcomes, system integration efforts, and strategic growth during calendar year 2025. The Transition Center continues to demonstrate measurable impact on public safety and justice system efficiency, including:

- A reduction in 30-day jail rebooking rates to 6 percent among participants, compared to 27 percent in the control group;
- A marked improvement in court appearance rate among individuals served, exceeding historical benchmarks for similar populations; and
- Significant growth in service demand, with over 11,600 points of service delivered in 2025 alone.

The report also documents expanded collaboration with law enforcement, courts, housing providers, and behavioral health partners, as well as the integration of mobile outreach strategies aligned with the Board of Supervisors One Pima, The Prosperity Initiative, and regional public safety priorities.

Looking ahead, the planned expansion to seven-day-a-week operations in 2026 will increase access to services at critical release points while strengthening coordination across systems. Continued attention to housing stabilization, data integration, and sustainable funding will be essential to maintaining and building upon current outcomes.
