<b>Purpose:</b>	Approval of this amendment will authorize an additional \$2,200,000.00 in funding and extend the contract term through June 30, 2027, ensuring the continuation of services for an additional year beginning July 1, 2026.

<b>Procurement Method Additional Info:</b>	Pursuant to Pima County Procurement Code 11.12.020, Competitive sealed proposals, Solicitation No. RFP-PCHD-2025-101 was conducted. One response was received.
<b>Program Goals/Predicted Outcomes:</b>	The Pima County Sobering Alternative for Recovery (SAFR) Center has provided stabilization and sobering services which support access to substance use disorder support in a therapeutic environment. The SAFR Center pilot has aimed to establish a trauma-informed, community-centered, medically monitored sobering facility in Pima County for individuals experiencing acute intoxication. Individuals may be referred by first responders, emergency rooms, law enforcement as an alternative to jail, or self-referral to stabilize and coordinate referral to other supports and services when appropriate. The pilot will evaluate the feasibility and impact of such a model, with the goal of developing a long-term, sustainable approach that reduces harm, promotes recovery, and strengthens care coordination. Continued efforts will focus on operationalizing the sobering center model, strengthening cross-system collaboration, monitoring performance and outcomes, and identifying long-term funding and sustainability strategies.
<b>Public Benefit and Impact:</b>	Through this project, Pima County and its partner jurisdictions will pilot a Sobering Facility that uses trauma-informed care, peer support, and best practices to provide a safe stabilization and connection to services. The SAFR Center will reduce unnecessary emergency system utilization, and build a foundation for more effective, person-centered care in Pima County for those who meet the eligibility requirements.

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**CONTRACT AMENDMENT**

The parties agree to amend the above-referenced contract as follows:

**1. Background and Purpose**

1.1. Background. On November 18, 2025, County and Contractor entered into the above referenced agreement to provide comprehensive, leading-edge care and structured coordination among healthcare and social services providers, first responders, law enforcement and the criminal justice system through the SAFR Center Sobering Facility.

1.2. Purpose. County requires additional time and funding to provide services.

**2. Term.** The County is exercising the first extension option to renew the contract for one additional year commencing on July 1, 2026, and terminating on June 30, 2027. If the commencement date is before the Effective Date of this amendment, the parties will, for all purposes, deem the amendment to have been in effect as of the commencement date.

**3. Maximum Payment Amount.** The maximum amount the County will spend under this Contract, as set forth in Section 5.2, is increased by \$2,200,000.00. County's total payments to Contractor under this contract, including any sales taxes, will not exceed \$4,060,851.98.

All other provisions of the Contract not specifically changed by this Amendment remain in effect and are binding upon the parties.




