PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, we all witness the growing racial divisiveness across our urban, suburban, rural and tribal communities today that threatens the very core of democracy; and

WHEREAS, the impact of the racial inequities is clear and underscored by the systems that perpetuate inequity and injustice, which have been generations in the making; and

WHEREAS, like those who came before us, it is our duty to protect children, and maintain communities in which they may all be given the opportunity to succeed; and

WHEREAS, we understand and recognize that we must all work to heal the wounds created by racial, ethnic and religious bias and build an equitable and just society so that all can thrive; and

WHEREAS, all individuals have the right to be provided every opportunity to learn, grow, and thrive in nurturing environments that don't jeopardize their safety, dignity and humanity; and

WHEREAS, every person has the capability to make a simple change within him or herself that can have a profound effect on an entire society; and

WHEREAS, if we all dedicate ourselves to a process that brings individuals and communities to wholeness, repairs the damage caused by racism and transforms societal structures into ones that affirm the inherent value of all people, we can bring about the necessary changes in thinking and behavior that will propel this great country forward as a society where everyone belongs; and

WHEREAS, racial healing is a vital and crucial commitment to the educational, social, mental and overall well-being of us all.
